

Friday January the 1 - 1836

All these 24 hours fine weather at 1 P.M. lowered truck and killed a whale took it to the ship at 3 cut her in commenced boiling plenty whales in light. Latter part light no whales ship Lucas a cutting the Arm of Sagharbour in light thus ends Lat. 37.57
Long 18.00

Saturday Jan. 2 1836

first part fine weather spoke the arm she had 12 right whales and a small spin whale at 7 lighted whales lowered did not faster. Latter part rainy weather at 11 A.M. lighted a dead whale and took it to the ship thus ends
Lat. 38.10
Long 18.10

Sunday Jan. 3 1836

Commenced with fresh breezes at 8 A.M. cut in the whale middle part strong gales at 1 P.M. latter part the same employed in boiling blowing away oil and getting up hooks thus ends
Lucas in light boiling

Lat in 37.30
Long in 18.15

Monday Jan. 4 1836

Commenced with strong gales at 1 P.M. middle and latter part light breezes at 1 P.M. lighted no whales thus ends
Lucas in light Lat. in 37.10
Long in 18.20

Tuesday Jan. 5

first part light breezes at calm middle part wind N.W.E. ship heading S.W.E. Latter part fresh breezes at N.W.E. lighted a whale lowered did not faster thus ends employed in blowing down oil Lucas in light
Lat. 37.50
Long 18.30

Wednesday Jan. 6 1836

first part fresh breezes at N.W.E. ship heading to the South. Latter part light air and calm lighted a whale lowered got fast and killed the whale at 11 took it to the ship thus ends Lat. in 38.18
Lucas in light cutting Long in 17.50

Thursday Jan. 7 1836

Commenced with light breezes at calm cut in the whale at 5 P.M. lighted a whale lowered and took to the ship at 7 Latter part calm cut in the whale thus ends employed boiling getting up hooks and other work
Lucas in light boiling Lat. in 38.20
Long in 17.55

Friday Jan. 8 1836

All these 24 hours light air and calm lighted whales lowered did not faster all hands employed in boiling and blowing away ~~the~~ oil Lucas in light
boiling thus ends Lat. in 38.25
Long in 17.50
