

Saturday Jan. 9<sup>th</sup> 1836

First part fine weather sighted whales  
and chased did not fasten latter  
part thick weather took 2 whales  
a long side at 10.30 A.M. and commenced  
cutting this early Lucas in light  
Lat. in 38.30  
Long in 18.00

Sunday Jan. 10 1836

First part thick weather cut in the  
whales latter light breeze and fair  
weather employed in bailing stowing oil  
between decks this early  
Lat. 39.01  
Long 18.10

Monday Jan. 11

pleasant weather employed in  
bailing stowing away oil &c. latter  
fresh breeze at west and much sighted  
the Lucas take a whale  
Lat. in 39.20  
Long in 18.30

Tuesday Jan. 12

First part fresh Gale at west  
latter part moderate windy but  
a bad sea employed as the day previous  
this early Lucas in light bailing  
Lat. in 39.20  
Long in 18.50

Wednesday Jan. 13 1836

First part fresh breeze at west  
latter part more moderate sighted  
whales latter part at noon still  
part this early finished bailing  
at 11 A.M. Lucas in light cuts  
last to 2 whales Lat. in 39.19  
Long in 17.50

Thursday Jan. 14

First part light breeze and heavy  
weather at 6 P.M. took the whale to  
the ship latter part cut her in this  
early employed in stowing away oil  
Lucas in light cutting Lat. in 39.30  
Long in 17.30

Friday Jan. 15<sup>th</sup>

Commenced with strong breeze at 2 P.M.  
sighted a whale latter part and last  
2 lines latter part much employed  
in bailing &c. Lucas in light bailing  
Lat. in 39.40  
Long in 17.00

Saturday Jan. 16<sup>th</sup>

those 24 hours fresh breeze and much  
employed in bailing sighted nothing  
but the Lucas this early Lat. in 39.50  
Long in 17.00

Sunday Jan. 17

Sighted a strange Port  
Lat. in 39.35 Long in 16.50  
First part fresh breeze sighted a whale  
latter part did not fasten latter moderate employed  
in stowing down oil at 10 sighted whales latter  
and took one this early Lucas took a whale
