First part fresh breezes at N.E. Employed in cutting &c at 4 P.M. sawd for whales got fast and parted last the whale. Latter part foggy Employed in hauling Lucas in company. Lat. in 39.45 Long in 16.45

Tuesday Jan. 19 1836

First part of these 24 hours light breezes at N.N.W. Ship heading to the westward middle part strong breezes at west latter part the same ship heading N.N.W. at A.M. finished coiling this ends Employed in raising away oil Lucas in sight. Lat. 39.34 S. Long 16.20 W.

Wednesday Jan. 20

First breezes at N.N.W. and raised ship heading N.E. At Daylight made sail and hauled S.E. Light & sail at noon spoke ship Cadmus of Sag. Harbour with 850 whale 250 sperm. The Liverpool in sight with 1400 Lucas in sight. Lat. in 39.26 S. Long in 15.40

Thursday Jan 21

First part fresh breezes at N.W. Ship heading S.E. middle and latter part strong gales Ship lying under close reef topsail and jalousie Light nothing this ends. Lat. 39.40 Long 15.50

Friday Jan. 22 1836

Commenced with strong gales at N.W. at 9 P.M. lost the watch boat middle and latter part strong gales at daylight wore ship and heading N.E. and set the topsails this ends Lucas in sight. Lat. in 39.50 Long in 16.00

Saturday Jan 23

First part strong gales at N.W. Ship heading N.E. under main topsail & for sail middle part strong at west latter part moderate breezes at N.W. with a heavy swell this ends Lucas in sight. Lat. 38.40 Long 15.30

Sunday Jan. 24

First part light breezes and calm sighted 2 whales sawd and chased Lucas boats got fast to both whales got one of her boats stove and called for assistance we accordingly assisted and took one of the to the Valley arm for one half of the oil latter part cut her in ends with strong gales at the north Lucas in cutting. Lat. in 38.45 Long in 15.45

Monday Jan. 25

All these 24 hours strong gales at North Ship heading P.N.E. Employed in coiling under the m. topsail and bent another in its place this ends Lucas in sight. Lat. in 38.39 Long in 14.50
