

Tuesday Jan. 26<sup>th</sup> 1836

First part fresh Gale at S.W. heading N.E. Middle part Calm later part Strong Breeze at west at 8 A.M. finished Boiling and sighted a whale sawed did not fasten thus End Ship heading North. Lucas in Sight

Wednesday Jan. 27<sup>th</sup> 1836

Strong Gale at west Ship heading North middle and later part the same Employed in Stowing a whale down air thus End Lucas in Sight Lat. in 37.55 Long. in 13.55

Thursday Jan 28<sup>th</sup> 1836

Strong Gale from W.S.W. Steering N. by E. later part fresh Breeze at 10 A.M. sighted a Sperm whale sawed did not fasten whale going quick N.N.W. thus End Lucas in Sight Lat. 36.23 Long. 13.00

Friday Jan. 29<sup>th</sup> 1836

Commenced with fresh Breeze at west. S.W. at 4 P.M. sighted right whales sawed did not fasten at 6 sighted another sawed did not fasten. later part fresh Breeze sighted nothing Employed in carrying Main sail and Main top Gall Pail Lat. 36.29 Long. 12.00

Saturday Jan. 30 1836

Fresh Breeze from the North. at 2 P.M. sighted 2 whales sawed and chased did not fasten middle and later part fresh Breeze at N.N.W. at Day light saw whales sawed did not fasten at 7 sawed again got fast and killed the whale got a Coat Capsized but injured nothing took the whale to Lucas in return for the last whale taken to Sally Anne at 10 sawed again got fast and stove Cadley but no one injured lost the whale thus End with Strong Breeze and wind ed. sighted several whales Lucas in Sight ending Lat. 36.23 Long. 12.50

Sunday Jan. 31 1836

these 24 hours Strong Breeze and wind at 2 P.M. sighted a gam of right whales sawed got fast also got the Coat Cadley stove lost the whale but no one hurt later part raining thus End Lucas in Sight Lat. 36.15 Long. 12.50

Monday Feb. 1 1836

Strong Gale at S.W. Ship heading E.N.E. Middle part Squally at 7 A.M. sighted Grindall bearing S.E. Dist 40 miles later part Strong Breeze and rainy weather thus End Lucas in Sight Lat. in 36.20 Long. in 12.00
