

Tuesday Feb. 2^d. 1836

First part fresh breezes at west
at 3 P.M. sighted night whales
sawed did not fasten middle
and latter part fresh breezes at
S.W. Ship heading W.N.W. sighted
whales gaining ground S.W. sawed
several times did not get fast
thus ends *Trichechus* bearing
S.E. Dist 55 miles
Lucas in sight got a boat from
the Pan

Wednesday Feb. 3^d. 1836

First part fresh breezes Ship heading
South at 7 P.M. tacked Ship and
steered North Ship under double reef
topsails latter part wind west and
blowing fresh Employed in towing
down oil thus ends Lucas in sight
Lat. in 35° 14'
Long. in 11° 48'

Thursday Feb. 4th. 1836

Commenced with brisk breezes at
S.W. Ship heading N.N.E. shuddered
and latter part moderate sighted
no whales thus ends
Lucas in sight Lat. in 33° 00'
Long. in 11° 00'

Friday Feb. 5th. 1836

Lat. 32° 20' These 24 hours light breezes at the
long North Ship head N.W. till 12 Night then
headed to the Eastward Employed in
changing sails thus ends Lucas in sight

Saturday Feb. 6th. 1836

These 24 hours fine weather with
light wind and calm sighted finback
thus ends Lucas in sight
Lat. in 32° 18'
Long. in 11° 50'

Sunday Feb. 7th. 1836

fine weather and Pleasant breezes
North Ship heading E.N.E. sighted
no whales thus ends Lucas in sight
Lat. in 31° 46'
Long. in 10° 50'

Monday Feb. 8th

All these 24 hours light breezes
at N.E. Ship heading N.E. & E.
sighted no whales Lucas in sight
thus concludes Employed in ship duty
Lat. in 30° 47'
Long. in 9° 10'

Tuesday Feb. 9th. 1836

All these 24 hours light breezes at
N.E. & W. Ship heading N.E. & E.
Employed in ship duty sighted no
whales ends Lucas in sight
Lat. in 29° 30'
Long. in 7° 50'

Wednesday Feb. 10th

All these 24 hours light breezes and
fine weather at sunset sighted
Shanting fish Dist 4 miles Shouted
sail at 12 wore Ship and headed
to the westward latter part sighted nothing
but Ship Lucas Lat. in 28° 30' Long. in 6° 50'
