

Remarks on board Barque Sappho

Sunday June 13-1852

Begin with light air from the Westward
At 2 P.M. saw Spearman Whales Landed
all 4 boats



Struck and killed one At 4 P.M. took
him along side and got ready for cutting
At 5 P.M. commence to cut at 12 P.M.
finish cutting

Lat by Obs 39-10 N Long by Chron 44-10 W

Monday June 14-1852

Begin with light air & calm employed
in clearing away the head. At midnight
commence boiling Saw several sails

Lat by Obs 38-58 N Long by Chron 44-55 W

Tuesday June 15-1852

Begin with light air from S.W. heading
to the S.E. Employed in boiling Latter
part steering E by S Two sails in sight
Lat by Obs 38-53 N Long by Chron 44-25 W

Wednesday June 16-1852

Begin with a fine breeze and pleasant
weather from S.W. steering E by S At
5 P.M. steering S.W. saw a sail
Two Boats Employed in boiling At
9 A.M. finish boiling and wash up
the decks

Lat by Obs 38-25 N Long by Chron 43-05 W

Thursday June 17-1852

Begin with a good breeze from S.W. steering
E Under double reef topsails Middle and
Latter part blowing fresh At 9 A.M. the
wind hauled to S took in fore top sail

Under A. Boiz steering E

Lat by Obs 39-23 N Long by Chron 44-4

On her outward bound Passage

Capt Howland

Friday June 18-1852

Begin with a moderate gale from S.W.
heading to the South At 5 P.M. keep
off E Saw a Brig heading to the N.W.
Employed in ship duty

Lat by Obs 39-17 N Long by Chron 39-30 W

Saturday June 19-1852

Begin with strong gales from S.W. steering
E Under double reef topsails Middle
and Latter part passing squalls of
wind and rain Saw one Tin Boat

Lat by Obs 40-15 N Long by Chron 36-20 W

Sunday June 20-1852

Begin with strong gales from the West
ward steering E At 4 P.M. steering E.S.E.
Middle and Latter part light gales At
10 A.M. spoke the Ship Crown of
Liverpool 17 days out with 439
passengers bound to New York put
letters on board



Lat by Obs 41-00 N Long by Chron 34-45 W

Monday June 21-1852

Begin with fine gales from S.W. steering
E At 11 P.M. and then took in
sail and hauled by the wind to the S
Saw several sails. At 5 A.M. spoke
the ship, S. J. of Fair Haven 22 Days out
with 800 bbls of Spearman oil
