

Remarks on board Barque Sappho

Sunday June 22-1852

Begin with strong gales under double reef top sails. At 7 P.M. haul by the wind to the north. Several sails in sight. At 9 A.M. saw the Island of Flores bearing N.W.E. Dist 30 miles. Employed in cooping the cill steering for the land.

Wednesday June 23-1852

Begin with light gales from West running down the South side of Flores. At 7 P.M. bearing S.W.W. Dist 10 miles. Several sails in sight. At 11 A.M. 3 P.M. haul back. At 5 A.M. haul off E.S.E. saw Fin Backs.

No Obs

Thursday June 24-1852

Begin with light gales and pleasant weather from the Westward steering E.S.E. At 7 P.M. haul by the wind to the South Middle part squally. At day light saw Fayal bearing S.W.E. Dist 25 miles. Dist 20 A.M. spoke Brig E. Nicholson of Province town 6 Months out 25 lbs of Sp cill and one hundred of Hump Back.



No Obs

Friday June 25-1852

Begin with light gale lying off an. and Fayal. At 8 A.M. The Captain went ashore and got a Pilot and came to anchor in 20 fath of water.

Of Western Islands

Saturday June 26-1852

Lying at anchor at Fayal employed in finding a leak in the ship. Found it and stop it. At 10 A.M. boat went on shore after onions and potatoes and shipped 4 Portuguese and landed 10 lbs of Sp cill.

Sunday June 27-1852

Begin with light gales. At 3 P.M. haul up the anchor and went to sea. Winds from W.W. to W.N.W. at 7 P.M. Fayal bearing W.W.E. Dist 12 miles. Middle and Latter part the wind the same. A sail in sight. Saw Fin Backs. Lat by Obs 37-19 N Long by Obs 29-30 W.

Monday June 28-1852

Begin with a fine gale from W.W. heading W.W.E. Under all sail. At 7 P.M. took in the light sails. Middle and Latter part the same. A sail in sight. Saw Fin Backs.

Tuesday June 29-1852

Begin with a fine wind and pleasant weather from W.W. heading to the Eastward. saw one sail. At 7 P.M. Fayal bearing W.W.E. Dist 30 miles. saw Fin Backs.

Wednesday June 30-1852

Begin with a calm employed in sheathing the decks. Latter part light air from the South. Saw Fin Backs and Fayal. St. George & graciosa.
