Saturday Aug 28-1852

First part calm employed in cleaning
and painting the iron work Middle
part light air from the West Sailing
of 8 on the 5th of Bravo Latter part
at 2 Ce the Capt went on shore to
trade for some bags
No Obs

Sunday Aug 29-1852

First part laying of an on the 5th of Bravo
at 6 Ce the Captain came on board
with a lot of Hogs and Swabs and
ship a man Native by the name of Peter
and keep of 8 by the saw black fish
Middle and Latter part Strong gales
from S E steering S S W
Lat by Obs 13-30 N Long by Chr 25-55 W

Monday Aug 30-1852

First part light wind from S E steering
S S W 3 sails in sight Middle part calm
Latter part saw black fish several all
boats got one and took  him
on board 5 sails in sight
Lat by Obs 12-52 N Long by Chr 25-55 W



Tuesday Aug 31-1852

First part light air from N E steering
S S W kept of 8 by the several
sails in sight Middle and Latter
part wind and weather the same
Lat by Obs 11-43 N Long by Chr 25-51 W


On her outward bound Passage
Wednesday Sept 1-1852

First part light wind from N E steering
S by the saw black fish employed in
boiling the black fish Middle part
wind and weather the same Latter
part light air from E steering S by the
Lat by Obs 10-43 N Long by Chr 25-45 W

Thursday Sept 2-1852

First part light air from S W at 5 Ce
took ship to the S E. Saw several sails
Middle and Latter part took ship
several time saw black fish several
3 boats got 2 and took them on board
  light air from S
So Ends
Lat by Obs 10-36 N Long by Chr 25-30 W

Friday Sept 3-1852

First part light air from S to S W at 2 Ce
spoke Barque Ellen of Argentina 3 months
out 3500 of up bill  Middle part
squally Latter part light gales
from S E heading S by the employed in boiling
the black fish several sails in sight
Lat by Obs 9-51 N Long by Chr 25-45 W

Saturday Sept 4-1852

First part light gales from W steering
S by the Middle part wind haul N W
steering S by the Latter part wind
N W steering the same employed
in chit ditty
Lat by Obs 8-45 N Long by Chr 24-00 W
