Tuesday Sept 14-1852

First part light gales from E. S. E. steering
W by S Middle part wind S E steering
the same latter part at 10 o'clock
W by W Saw Fin Backs.

Lat by Obs 9-14 S Long by Chr 28-26 W

Wednesday Sept 15-1852

First part strong gales from S E steering
W by W Middle and latter part wind
and weather the same. Employed in
setting up the fore Rigg.

Lat by Obs 10-20 S Long by Chr 30-42 W

Thursday Sept 16-1852

First part strong gales from the S E
steering W by W Under all sail Middle
and latter part wind and weather
the same. With a heavy swell from
the South several sails in sight.

Lat by Obs 12-22 S Long by Chr 32-52 W

Friday Sept 17-1852

First part strong gales from S. S. E. steering
W by W at 4 o'clock hauled up S. W. a sail
in sight. Middle and latter part wind
and weather the same saw nothing of note.

Lat by Obs 14-30 S Long by Chr 34-58 W

Saturday Sept 18-1852

First part fine gales and pleasant
weather from S E steering W by W at 4 o'clock
hauled up S. W. a sail in sight. Middle
and latter part wind and weather
the same saw several sails.

Lat by Obs 15-52 S Long by Chr 36-09 W

On her outward bound Passage

Sunday Sept 19-1852

First part strong gales from E. S. E. steering
S. S. W. At 3 o'clock spoke the Barque Minrod
of Sag harbor 14 months out 400 of Sp. Oil.



At sun set took in light sails for the
night heading S. S. E. Latter part
kept off at 6 o'clock S. S. W. Saw Fin Backs
and 2 sails.

Lat by Obs 18-22 S Long by Chr 36-28 W

Monday Sept 20-1852

First part light gales and pleasant weather
from E. S. E. steering S. S. W. At sun down took
in sail and luff by the wind heading S. S. E.
2 sails in sight. Middle part laying a back
until day light and then kept off West
Saw Fin Backs.

Lat by Obs 19-08 S Long by Chr 38-55 W

Tuesday Sept 21-1852

First part strong gales from S E by E
steering W by S and W. S. W. At 4 o'clock hauled
by the wind heading W E by W at
5 o'clock took in sail. Middle part put
1 reef in the fore topsail. Latter part
at 11 o'clock saw Thump Backs. Landed 3 boats
but without success came on board and
were ship to East.

Lat by Obs 18-23 S Long by Chr 39-51 W

Wednesday Sept 22-1852

First part strong gales from W. N. E. steering E by S
At sun set shorten sail and luff by the wind.
Middle & latter part light gales from W
steering E. S. E. a sail in sight.

Lat by Obs 19-10 S Long by Chr 36-39 W
