

Remarks on board Barge Supply

Thursday Sept 23-1852

First part light air and calm. Asail in sight. Employed in getting down the Main Rigging. Middle part light gales from E.S.E. heading S. Latter part at 6 o'clock kept of S.S.W. At 11 o'clock saw a large whale. Landed 4 boats.

Lat by Obs 20-00 S Long by Chr 37-00 W

Friday Sept 24-1852

First part the boats in chase of the whale. At 5 o'clock gave him up and came on board. Towed ship to W.E. at sun down shortened sail. Latter part made all sail and kept of S by W saw a plenty of Hump Backs. Landed but without success 2 sails in sight.

Lat by Obs 20-18 S Long by Chr 36-42 W

Saturday Sept 25-1852

First part light gales and pleasant weather from E.W.E. steering S.S.W. saw Hump Backs. At sun set shortened sail. Middle part heading E.S.E. Latter part made all sail and kept of S.W. by W.

Lat by Obs 21-49 S Long by Chr 33-00 W

Sunday Sept 26-1852

First part light gales and pleasant weather from W.E. steering S.S.W. At 6 o'clock kept of S.W. saw a Fin Back. Middle part the same. Latter part rainy steering S.S.W. saw Fin Back.

Lat by Obs 23-16 S Long by Chr 38-30 W

On her outward bound Passage

Monday Sept 27-1852

First part light gales and cloudy weather from W. W.E. steering S.S.W. Middle part the same. Latter part at 11 o'clock saw Hump Backs. Landed 3 boats but without success. Several sails in sight.

Lat by Obs 24-37 S Long by Chr 38-30 W

Tuesday Sept 28-1852

First part strong gales from W.W.E. steering S.S.W. At 4 o'clock kept of S.W. by S 2 sails in sight. Middle and Latter part strong gales from W.E. and a heavy swell from the north.

Lat by Obs 27-21 S Long by Chr 39-57 W

Wednesday Sept 29-1852

First part strong gales from W.W.E. steering S.W. by S by W. Saw Fin Backs. Middle and Latter part light air from W.W.E. to S.S.E. with a plenty of rain. No Ends.

Lat by Obs 29-00 S Long by Chr 41-20 W

Thursday Sept 30-1852

First part strong gales from S.S.E. heading E by the wind. At 1 o'clock were ship to the S.W. with a plenty of rain. At 6 o'clock took in the light sails heading N. S.W. Middle and Latter part light gales from W heading N. S.W. by the wind saw Hump Back and several sails in sight.

Lat by Obs 29-33 S Long by Chr 43-00 W
