

Remarks on board Barque Hoppo
Friday October 1-1852

First part light gales from S heading
W. N. W. by the wind. Saw Hump Backs
3 sails in sight. Middle part strong
gales from S heading the same at
12 Oc took in Main top Gallant sail
and flying Sile. Latter part the same
at sail in sight and H. Backs.

Lat by Obs 29-42 S Long by Chr 45-38 W

Saturday Oct 2-1852

First part strong gales from S heading
N. W. W. and N. by S. Double reef the topsails
and took in the Main sail. Saw Hump
Backs 2 sails in sight. Middle part
light gales. Latter part at 3 Oc made
all prudent sail saw Fin Backs 2 sails

Lat by Obs 29-32 S Long by Chron 47-10 W

Sunday Oct 3-1852

First part light gales from S to S E heading
by the wind to N. W. at 6 Oc took in light
sails and Main sail. Middle part
wind hauled to W steering S. S. E. Latter
part wind and weather the same saw
Fin Backs and several sails

Lat by Obs 31-14 S Long by Chr 47-47 W

Monday Oct 4-1852

First part fine gales from W steering
South at 6 Oc kept of S. S. W. saw
Fin Backs and one sail. At sun set took
in sail for the night. Middle part the
same. Latter part steering S. E. at 10
Oc double reef the topsails. Saw Fin
Backs, a sail in sight.

Lat 33-11 S Long 47-44 W

On her outward bound Passage
Tuesday Oct 5-1852

First part strong gale from N. W. steering
E. S. E. Under double reef topsails at 1 Oc
set the Sile at 5 Oc took it in again and
were ship to the N. W. Middle part
squally. Latter part at day light
kept of N. W. Saw a plenty of Fin Backs
and several sails

Lat by Obs 33-24 S Long by Chr 48-44 W

Wednesday Oct 6-1852

First part light gales from E. N. E. steering
N. W. saw several sails and Fin Backs at
sun down shorten sail and luff by the
wind to the North. Middle part at 12 Oc
were ship to S. E. Latter part at day
light kept of N. W. Employed in ship

Lat by Obs 33-13 S Long by Chr 49-38 W

Thursday Oct 7-1852

First part fine gales and pleasant weather
from E. N. E. steering N. W. W. at 1 Oc kept
of N. W. at sun down shorten sail and
haul by the wind. S. E. Middle part at 12 Oc
were ship to W. Latter part at 6 Oc kept
of N. W. W. saw several sails at 10 Oc made
all sail and steering N. W.

Lat by Obs 34-23 S Long by Chr 49-58 W

Friday Oct 8-1852

First part strong gales from E. N. E. heading
S. E. by the wind. At 3 Oc took in the light
sails and double reef the topsails. At
sun down took in Sile & Main sail. Middle
and Latter part Under double reef top
sails heading S. E.

Lat by Obs 35-25 S Long by Chron 49-30 W
