Wednesday Nov 17-1852

First part heavy gales from W. S. W. to W. N. W.
At 4 o'clock moderate set the fore sail Middle
part wind from W. W. W. with a heavy swell
At 12 o'clock blowing heavy took in the fore sail
Latter part moderate made some sail
A sail in sight

Thursday Nov 18-1852

First part strong gales from W. W. steering
S. W. & S. W. by W. Saw five Barks and one sail
Middle part wind and weather the same
Latter part wind hauled to the S. W. Under
all prudent sail

Lat by Obs 51-34 S Long by Chr 62-51 W

Friday Nov 19-1852

First part strong gales from W. W. heading
W. W. by the wind at 4 o'clock wind ^{hauled} to W. W. W.
steering W. Middle part wind and weather
the same Latter part wind hauled to
W. W. W. steering S. W. two sails in sight

Lat by Obs 53-04 S Long by Chr 63-54 W

Saturday Nov 20-1852

First part fine gales and pleasant weather
from W. W. steering S. W. At 4 o'clock h. p. of
S. E. by S Under all sail. a sail in sight
Middle part calm Latter part light
winds from W. E. W. & E. saw Station
Land bearing S. S. W. Dist 15 miles

Lat by Obs 54-31 S Long by Chr 63-02 W

On her outward bound Passage

Sunday Nov 21-1852

First part light gales from S. W. to S. E. At 3
o'clock ship heading in shore At 4 o'clock
were ship to W. E. a sail in sight At 9 o'clock
saw Station Land bearing S. W. Dist 25 miles
steering S. S. E. Middle part steering W.
Latter part At 4 o'clock h. p. of S. S. W. saw the
land bearing W. W. Dist 30 miles passing squalls

Lat by Obs 55-20 S Long by Chr 63-41 W

Monday Nov 22-1852

First part light gales from W. steering S. S. W.
Under all sail Middle part squally Latter
part light air from S. W. and calm Cape
Horn bearing W. Dist 10 miles

Lat by Obs 56-00 S Long by Chr 64-20 W

Tuesday Nov 23-1852

First part calm at 4 o'clock light air from W. S. W.
heading S. by the wind Cape Horn bearing W.
Dist 10 miles Middle part strong gales at
10 o'clock took in the light sails Latter part
Under double reef topsails squally

Lat by Obs 57-34 S Long by Chr 65-39 W

Wednesday Nov 24-1852

First part strong gales from W. S. W. and
squally Under double reef topsails at 3
o'clock took in the main sail & Jib At 4 o'clock
were ship to W. W. and took in the fore
top sail Middle part moderate set the
fore top sail heading W. W. by the wind Latter
part At 5 o'clock took in the fore top sail
At 12 o'clock were ship to S.
