Thursday Nov 25 1852

First part moderate gale from N. N. W. at 5 o'clock close reef the fore topsail and set it at 8 o'clock reef the Main sail and set it Middle part at 11 o'clock reefed the St. Andrew and were ship to N. W. Latter part at 11 o'clock were ship Cape Horn bearing N. by E. 15 miles
Lat by Obs 56-18 S Long by Chr 67-00 W

Friday Nov 26 1852

First part heavy gales from N. N. W. Middle part more moderate under all sail Latter part calm saw frigate
Lat by Obs 57-20 S Long by Chr 66-14 W

Saturday Nov 27 1852

First part light gales from N. W. steering N. N. W. Middle part strong gales took in the light sails wind hauled to N. N. W. heading N. N. W. & S. W. by the wind Under double reef topsails Latter part more moderate made all prudent sail
Lat by Obs 58-00 S Long by Chr 65-20 W

Sunday Nov 28 1852

First part strong gales and cloudy weather from the N. heading S. by W. Under double reef topsails Middle part at 11 o'clock were ship heading N. by W. a sail in sight Latter part more moderate made some sail
Lat by Obs 58-53 S Long by Chr 71-16 W

Monday Nov 29 1852

First part light gales from N. N. W. heading S. W. & N. S. W. a sail in sight Middle and Latter parts Under all sail wind and weather the same
Lat by Obs 58-55 S Long by Chr 72-19 W

On her outward bound Passage

Tuesday Nov 30 1852

First part calm Middle and Latter part the same a sail in sight
Lat by Obs 58-53 S Long by Chr 72-30 W

Wednesday December 1 1852

First part light air from N. heading N. N. W. Middle part wind and weather the same Latter part light gales and squally
2 sails in sight
Lat by Obs 57-49 S Long by Chr 74-38 W

Thursday Dec 2 1852

First part light air from S. W. heading N. N. W. Middle and Latter part light air and calm from S. W. heading N. N. W. saw one sail
Lat by Obs 57-11 S Long by Chr 75-08 W

Friday Dec 3 1852

First part light gales from E. steering N. N. W. at 7 o'clock the wind hauled to E. S. E. saw 2 sails Middle part strong gales from E. S. E. steering N. N. W. Latter part wind and weather the same
Lat by Obs 58-24 S Long by Chr 77-44 W

Saturday Dec 4 1852

First part strong gales from E. steering N. N. W. Under all sail Middle part wind and weather the same Latter part strong gales and passing squalls of wind and rain
at 5 o'clock took in the light sails
Lat by Obs 58-24 S Long by Chr 80-18 W

Sunday Dec 5 1852

First part fresh gales from E. in the forenoon steering N. N. W. at 1 o'clock wind hauled N. heading N. N. W. Middle part light air Latter part fresh gales from S. steering N. N. W.
Lat by Obs 59-22 S Long by Chr 80-30 W
