Thursday March 24 1853

At anchor. one watch employed in painting
the stern. One watch on Liberty

Friday March 25 1853

Employed in haring down the rig on one
watch ashore on Liberty

Saturday March 26 1853

Employed in sundry jobs. one watch on
Liberty. Barge Henry the barge laying off an
on 150 lbs of oil. In the port at 7 P.M. the
watch came off all out. Peerman & Sade
& George Reinhard. They deserted

Sunday March 27 1853

One watch ashore on Liberty. And your humble
servant staid at home and kept house

Monday March 28 1853

Employed in getting of recruits. And
Discharged 2. The unwarlike Child & Collins

Tuesday March 29 1853

At anchor. A boatman deserted by the name
of Kelley. Ship another by the name of Green
and ship H. L. Parker as 4th mate & 5th mate
at 10 A.M. hove up the anchor and went out
bound to Tombas point from S.E. steering N.W.

Wednesday March 30 1853

First part by light gales and pleasant
weather from the S.E. steering to the
Northward saw black fish latter part calm

Thursday March 31 1853

Began light gales and pleasant steering
N.E. Under all sail saw fin backs at 4
P.M. came to anchor at Tombas Bar in
a fathoms of water. In company with
Barge No Grande off Francisco 5 months
out with 60 lbs of black fish oil

Saturday Apr 2 1853

This 24 hours employed in getting of water
and stowing it down

Sunday Apr 3 1853

Laying at anchor in company with a ship
Charles Frederick 31 months out 8.00 sp. oil
& ship Mary Wilcox 7 months 2.50 sp. oil

Monday Apr 4 1853

Employed in getting of wood and trading
with the natives

Tuesday Apr 5 1853

Employed in getting of oranges & potatoes
light gales from S.E. and with a calm

Wednesday Apr 6 1853

First part laying at anchor all ready for
sea latter part fresh gales hove up the
anchor and went to sea. On bent the cables
and stowed them below

Leat by Obs 3-14 S Long by Obs 81-30 W

Thursday Apr 7 1853

First part light gales from S.E. heading N
by W middle part the same latter part
wind from S.E. steering W

Leat by Obs 3-19 S Long by Obs 82-40 W

Friday Apr 8 1853

First part light gales from E steering N
middle & latter part the same

Saturday Apr 9 1853

This 24 hours light gales steering N. S. W.
wind from S.E.

Leat by Obs 2-36 S Long by Obs 85-00 W
