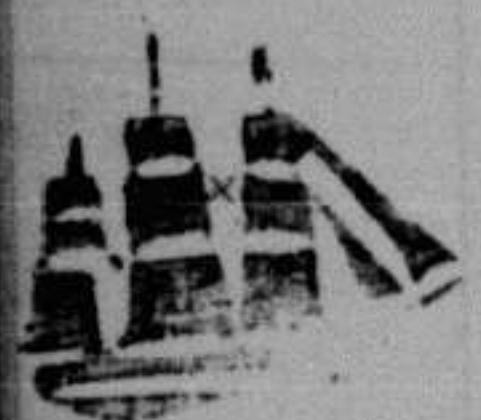


Remarks on board Margie Supple
Sunday June 5 1853

First part strong gales from W. N. W. heading
up along the land. Saw
a steamer bound down the coast to S.
Middle part strong gales from W. N. W. heading
W. at 12 O'clock ship heading in shore
at 2 O'clock ship again off shore. Latter
part at 7 O'clock spoke ship Charles Fred-
erick of New Bedford 34 months out
with 1300 bbls of sp oil. Saw Fin backs
& Black fish. On bent the main sail
and bent a nother Lat 27-44 N



Monday June 6 1853

First part strong gales from W. N. W. heading
up along the land. Saw Fin backs &
a sail & Seiros Island. Middle part
calm & sails in sight. Latter part
calm & sails in sight.

Tuesday June 7 1853

First part light gales from W. N. W. 3 sails
in sight. Middle and Latter part
calm. Employed in mending main
top sail. Saw plenty Black fish
bound in sight. Lat 27-39 N

Wednesday June 8 1853

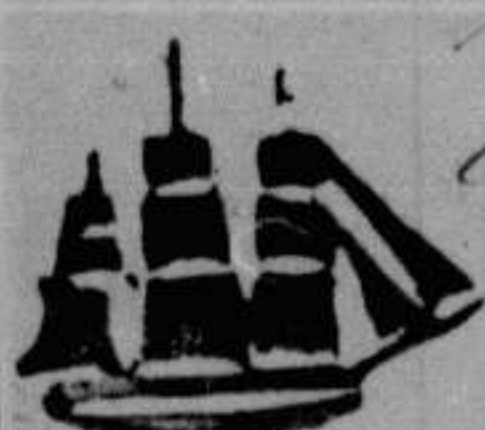
First part light gales from W. N. W.
working up the land to windward.
Employed in mending the main top
sails spoke Charles Frederick.
Middle part wind and weather the
same. Latter part finish the main
top sail. 4 sail in sight.

Whilst cruising on the California ground
Thursday June 9 1853

First part strong gales from W. N. W. in shore
to the land at 5 O'clock spoke ship Oliver
Crocker 34 months 1000 bbls of sp oil.
Middle & Latter part strong gales
saw Black fish & Fin backs.



Lat 27-55 N

Friday June 10 1853

First part strong gales from W. N. W. by W.
Spoke ship Two Brothers of New Bedford
1200 Whale & 800 sp oil. Benito Island
bearing N E of E. Middle part under short
sail. Latter part made all sail saw
Hump back. Loaded one boat but without
success. Employed in mending the main
spencer 2 sails in sight. Lat 28-07 N



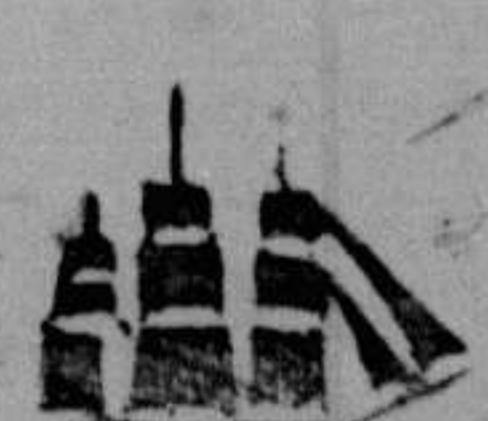
Saturday June 11 1853

First part strong gales from W. N. W.
At sun down shortened sail. Middle
part under short sail. Latter part
made all sail spoke Two Brothers
Benito Island bearing N E of E. Bird in sight.



Sunday June 12 1853

First part strong gales from W. N. W. in
company with the Two Brothers one Brig
in sight. Spoke ship Charles Frederick.
Middle part strong gales from W. N. W. Latter part
saw a steamer bound down the coast to S.
