

Remarks on board Barque Sappho Monday June 13-1853

First part strong gales from N.W. 3 sails
Middle part little more ship making
in shore. A man fell over board caught
hold of the fore sheet and save himself
Latter part made sail. At 7 A.M. saw the
land and run for it.

Tuesday June 14-1853

First part strong gales from N.W. 3 sails
in sight. At 10 A.M. spoke Brig Goaster of
St. Francisco 12 1/2 miles out with 5 hummer
bills of 4 will & the ship Oliver Crocker
of New Bedford. Middle part strong
gales. Latter part more moderate made
sail.

Wednesday June 15-1853

First part light gales from N.W. 3 sails
in sight. At sun down shorted sail heading
in shore saw Black fish. Middle & Latter
part light air & calm. Saw Black fish
land in sight.

Thursday June 16-1853

First part light gales from N.W. heading
N.W. E. At sun set took ship to West
saw Black fish 2 sail in sight. Middle
& Latter part light air from N.W. land
in sight. Saw a steamer bound North.

Friday June 17-1853

First part light gales from N.W. At 4 A.M. spoke
Charles Frederick & Two Brothers & Brig Goaster.

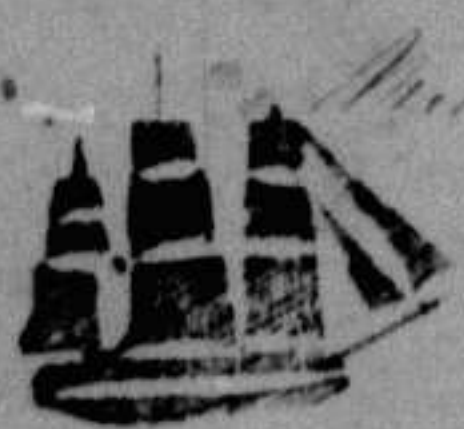
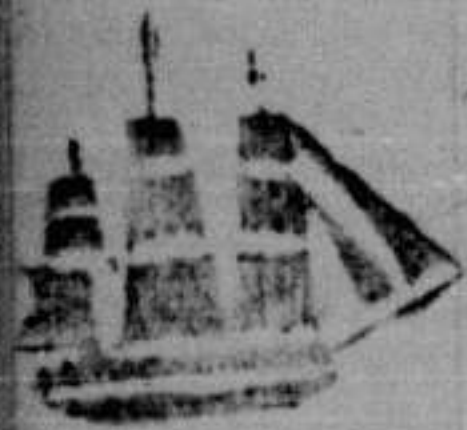
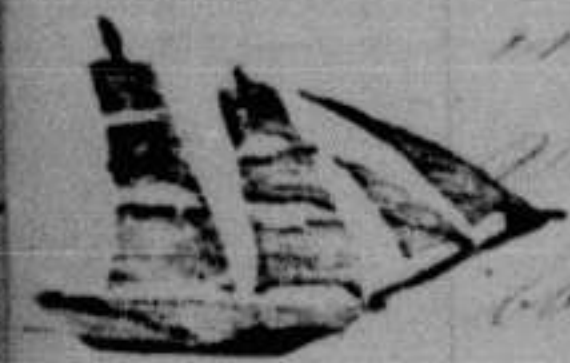

Whilst cruising on the California grounded Saturday June 18-1853

First part light gales from N.W. running down
towards the land. At 3 P.M. on the inside
heading of shore. Middle & Latter
part calm saw Killdeer 2 sail in sight.
Lat 27-30 N.

Sunday June 19-1853

First part calm 2 sails in sight. Middle
and Latter part calm spoke ship Two
Brothers the Captain came on board.

Monday June 20-1853

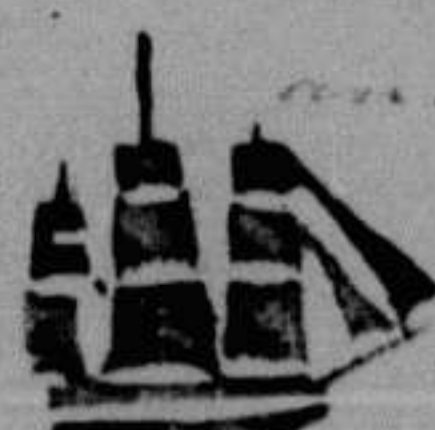
First part light air from N.W.
heading N.W. E. saw the land heading
N.W. 30 miles in company with the
Two Brothers. Saw Black fish. Middle
part of an on shore. Latter part heading
in for the land. Lat 28-29 N.

Tuesday June 21-1853

First part light gales from N.W. At
sun down close in to the land. The hills
of Bonito. Latter part strong gales
with the fog. At 4 P.M. saw the boats
ground out the mistake came on board
land heading N.W. 10 miles.

Wednesday June 22-1853

First part light gales from N.W. and large
weather. At 4 A.M. spoke ship Oliver Crocker & Two
Brothers and Charles Frederick.



Goaster. Middle part light gales from N.W.
Latter part close in to the land. Bonito
saw Black fish & Killdeer.
