

# Remarks on board Barge Sappho.

Friday July 1-1853

First part light gales from W. steering  
to have black fish. Lower part  
but without success. At sun down  
shorten sail. Middle & latter part  
light gales heading W. W. E. land in  
sight saw black fish.

Saturday July 2-1853

First part light gales from W. W.  
heading W. W. E. the land in sight & one  
sail. Middle part laying a back heading  
of three. Latter part made all sail  
close in to the land. Light gales.

Sunday July 3-1853

First part strong gales from W. W. spoke  
ship Charles Frederick. Middle part  
under short sail. Latter part at  
day light made sail and were ship  
two sails in sight.

Monday July 4-1853

First part fresh gales from W. W. heading  
W. W. E. two sails in sight. At sun down  
shorten sail. Latter part fresh gales.  
At 11 o'clock spoke the ship Charles Frederick  
and brig Hoaster. Enjoing the fourth  
of breaking out the after hold for  
brig & Hoaster for the Charles Frederick.

Tuesday July 5-1853

First part in company with the  
ship and brig. Middle part light  
air. Latter part kept off South  
head by to the California ground.  
Never want to see it again.



# Whist bounds down the Coast. South

Wednesday July 6-1853

First part light air from W. W. steering S. S. E.  
Under all sail. At sun down shorten  
sail. Middle part light air & calm.  
Latter part saw black fish. Lower  
all the boats but did not get any.  
came on board steering E. S. E.  
Lent by 25-20 W. Long by the 115-10 W.

Thursday July 7-1853

First part light air from W. saw black  
fish. Lower the boats but without success.  
came on board and shorten sail steering  
E. S. E. Middle part steering W. E. by E.  
Latter part light air & calm saw  
the land and black fish.

Lent by 25-52 W. Long by the 114-80 W.

Friday July 8-1853

First part light gales from W. W. steering  
W. E. saw black fish. Middle part steering  
W. E. by S. Latter part steering E. S. E.  
all sail in sight & saw black fish.  
Lent by 25-12 W. Long by the 113-31 W.

Saturday July 9-1853

First part strong gales from W. W. W.  
steering E. S. E. At 3 o'clock saw some thing we  
called off. Whales. run for them but  
saw nothing more of them. At sun  
down shorten sail. Middle part  
laying a back. Latter part steering  
E. S. E. saw nothing.
