

Remarks on board *Borgue* 1853

Tuesday Oct 11-1853

First part light gales from SE steering
W. W. C. Smith the spruce & bent it
at sail in sight at sun down shorter
sail and were ship Middle part
laying a back better part were ship
made sail at day light steering SE & E
Leat by the 2-27 S Long by the 92-24 S

Wednesday Oct 12-1853

First part light gales from SE steering
W. W. C. Smith the spruce & bent it
at sun down shorter sail and were
ship Middle part laying a back at
12 o'clock were ship better part light
gales steering W & E

Leat by the 4-33 S Long by the 92-24 W

Thursday Oct 13-1853

First part light air from SE steering
W & E by the sun the spruce & bent it
at sun down shorter sail and were
ship Middle part laying a back better part kept
off W & E till 10 o'clock and then steering W
at sail in sight

Leat by the 5-47 S Long by the 91-26 W

Friday Oct 14-1853

First part light gales from SE steering
at sun set off by the boat Middle part
laying off on shore better part made
all sail working toward by the 4 sails
in sight

Leat by the 5-15 S

Whist off by the Captain on shore sick Saturday Oct 15-1853

First part light gales working in toward
by the boat the boat and went
in shore after the Captain found him
very sick not able to come on board
Middle part laying off on shore
better part at 10 o'clock went in shore
with the boat. When the *Borgue* ^{came} bearing
up set on fire by the crew at 12 o'clock the
Doctor came off after things for the
Captain and went on shore again

Sunday Oct 16-1853

First part the boat came on board
and the we stood out to sea for a
cruise. Middle part the boat. Deep
gales from SE steering W & E by the
Middle part light gales bearing W & E
better part the same as sails in sight
deep the spruce & bent it

Leat by the 5-44 S Long by the 93-14 W

Monday Oct 17-1853

First part light gales from SE steering W
at 10 o'clock the boat ship bearing SE by E
Middle part at 12 o'clock the boat ship went
from W better part at 9 o'clock the boat ship
again light gales from SE sails in sight
when the spruce and the spruce
