part calm the land in sight
at day light

First part calm finish heaving At
2 P.M. Middle part light air head
ing in for the land Latter part
light gales from N.E. heading E
W.E. the land in sight

Saturday Apr 8 - 1854

First part light gales from E.S.E.
heading W.E. At 2 P.M. heave of
W.H.C. At sun down North head
bearing E by S Middle part head
ing off on shore Latter part
light air the ship of the latter
Bay. A sail in sight a cutting

Sunday Apr 9 - 1854

First part light gales from N
heading E.S.E. & E.S.E. Two sails in
sight At 4 P.M. spoke Barque

Elizabeth is within the net with
70 tons of sp. oil Middle part
heading of shore Latter part
at day light were ship head
ing in shore the sail in sight

Monday Apr 10 - 1854

First part light air At sun
down North head bearing E by E
Dist 12 Miles Middle & Latter
part calm end by sea in company
the O.R.



Tuesday Apr 11 - 1854

First part calm At 6 P.M. the
Captain of the Barque ^{Elizabeth} came
on board Middle part steering
W by N Latter part steering S
Employed in stowing down the
oil. Two sails in sight

Lat by Obs 11-38 Long by time 92-27 W

Wednesday Apr 12 - 1854

First part calm finish stowing
down the oil Middle part light
air steering S till 2 P.M. hence
then hauled a back the Main sail
Latter part At half past 9 P.M.
saw Sp Whales gain quick to the
Eastward launched the boats but
could not get near them being
calm



Lat by Obs 11-29 Long by time 92-30 W

Thursday Apr 13 - 1854

First part calm the boats in chase
of the whales At 3 P.M. came on board
whales out of sight Middle part
heading E.S.E. Latter part
light air & calm
