Friday Sept 22-1854

First part fine weather & light
gales from NW by S heading SE
by S At sun down tack ship
of shore Point Barrow bearing
E by S Middle part calm
Latter part light wind
from SE heading S. S. W but
the cables. At half past 11 O.
tack ship to SE

Lat by Obs 4-42 S Long by Chron

Saturday Sept 23-1854

First part light air from S, S. W
heading E. S. E & S. E saw 3 bl. wh.
fish. Lowered one boat but with
out success came on board
a Barque in sight At sun
down Payta head bearing SE by E
Middle part at 9 O. calm till
1 O. & then a wind from SE
heading S. S. W At 4 1/2 O. tack ship
to E Latter part working up the
toward Payta

Lat 5-00 S

Sunday Sept 24-1854

First part fresh gales from S
steering E by S At 2 O. came to
Anchor in Payta harbour in 9 fath
om of water and gave her 50 fathoms
of chain. And your Uncle went
ashore Latter part One watch
ashore on liberty



Lying in Payta Sept 25-1854

Monday Sept 25-1854

First part One watch ashore on
liberty Latter part at 8 O. the
watch came off and the other
watch went on liberty

Tuesday Sept 26-1854

This 24 hours one watch ashore on
liberty. The other employed in
ship duty. Discharged James Brown
boat storer & James Whitney
ship keeper & Robert Finton 3 O.
and 2 Spangars

Wednesday Sept 27-1854

This 24 hours one watch ashore on
liberty and the other attending to
ship duty Latter part at 8 O.
the watch came off & the other
went ashore on liberty

Thursday Sept 28-1854

This 24 hours as usual one watch
ashore on liberty the other on
duty

Friday Sept 29-1854

This 24 hours the same one
watch ashore the other at work
on board

Saturday Sept 30-1854

This 24 hours got of 29 Bbls of Potatoes
& 9 Bbls of onions one watch ashore
on liberty
