Tuesday Oct 2nd Commenced with light breezes from
the S E Starling Ship & 6 Pm spoke the
Ship Sophia Thornton of New Bedford and had a
gunn mill and later part 6 Pm broke out the
turbid tide forward of the main hatch and pumped the
ground and filled it with salt water this part the
Suppho was to part for the Sophia Thornton who left
her for a stern Lat 1 17 Long 22 35 W

Wednesday Oct 3rd Commenced with fresh breezes from
the S W heding W this part in play in pumping fresh
water and filling the hold with salt water 4 Pm saw
1 sail half past 4 tacked ship to the S E Squally
middle and later this part saw 14 sail W. W. W.
was a steamer finished Starling the main hatch
Lat 1 14 Long 21 03 W

Thursday Oct 4th Commenced with fresh breezes from
the S heding S E by E 4 Pm spoke ship heding S W
in a squall middle and later part this part Ship
Starling Ship W half past 4 1/2 boats for
black fish they were going to part for us
gave then up came on and raining hard

Friday Oct 5th Commenced with light breezes from
the W S W heding S by E this part saw 11 sails
middle and later part this part strong breezes from
the S W heding S E this part rove new main
top gallant clew lines Lat 1 01 Long 19 03 W

Saturday Oct 6th Commenced with fresh breezes from
the S W heding S E by S this part rove new fore top gall
ant clew lines and hal yards Wane in and out a half
knot middle and later part this part saw black
fish and got Wane W boat this part rove new
main top gallant braces and main top gallant hal
yards Lat 1 32 Long 17 11

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Sunday Oct 7th Commenced with fresh breezes from the S W heding
S E this part in play in minding the black fish
saw a sail on the weather beam Sunday tacked ship
middle and later part this part usually saw 1 sail
Lat 1 45 Long 17 42

Monday Oct 8th Commenced with shifting winds with rain
tacked three times heding from W to S W and from E to
S E dark 7 heding W with rain middle and later part
this part in play in boiling black fish and the rest
in play in washing close Lat 3 33 Long 17 25

Tuesday Oct 9th Commenced with fresh breezes from the S
heding W S W saw 14 sail heding the Saine

The Captain in play in fitting a new port rope to the
Main top sail yard and lashed the jaws of the yard
half past 4 tacked ship to the Eard dark tacked
back again heding W by S. A ship and brig of the
West or Quarter mill and later part this part in play
in bunking out the after hold for meat Lat 4 40 Long 20 19

Wednesday Oct 10th Commenced with light breezes from
the S W heding W 4 Pm tacked ship heding S by E wind
W S W light breeze middle and later part this part
in play in setting up the fore stays and all of the
had given ship heding S by E Lat Long

Thursday Oct 11th Commenced with light airs from
the W S W heding S by E in play in setting up the
fore top mast back stays and top gallant back stays
5 Pm toward 4 boats for black fish
the West Boat struck Wane and got home
middle and later part this part in play in
setting up the main top mast back stays and top gallant
and reel Lat 1 17 Long 19 11

Friday Oct 12th Commenced with brisk breezes from the
S W heding S E by E this part in play in setting up the
main top mast rigging and minding the flukes
middle and later part heding S E this part
in play in boiling black fish Lat 50 miles Long 18 11 W
