Saturday Nov 18th Commences with strong breezes from the N.W.

2 P.M. Saw three sail steering to the south 2 P.M. heavy squalls
brought in the light sails middle and later took in all sail but
a double reef main top sail. 11 A.M. close reefed it blowing at
gale from the S.W. a snow storm blowing hard all of this part

Monday Nov 19th this part hauled the main sail in taking it in
blowing a gale from the S.W. lying two heading S.E. boats
up to the lar'g heads middle and later 3 A.M. all sail out
his part in place in sending the main sail down and
upaid it Lat 56 37 Long 67 40

Tuesday Nov 20th Commences with fresh breezes from
the S.W. 1 P.M. bent the main sail heading S.E. 4 P.M.
tacked ship to the N.W. strong breezes took in the
fore top gallant sail 1 P.M. when she lay by middle and later
tacked ship to the S.E. Lat 56 37 Long 67 40

Wednesday Nov 21st Commences with the wind from the
S.W. heading from W to N.W. with all sail out 3 P.M.
fresh breezes middle part heading W by S. later the same 11 A.M.
tacked ship heading S.W. wind N.W. Lat 56 18 Long 64 45

Thursday Nov 22nd Commences with light breezes from
the S.W. in place in sailing sea more rough
staysill prevents 2 P.M. saw an ice burgh two points
on the weather bow 1 P.M. it bore S.W. by S. 1 P.M.
light from the wind middle part steering S.W. 3 A.M.
wind 1 P.M. thick fog steering S.W. wind light Lat 56 37 Long 66 21

Friday Nov 23rd Commences with light breezes from the south
steering S.W. saw three sail 1 P.M. wind N.W. by S heading
S.W. by S saw a ship two points forward of the weather beam head
ing to the S.W. this part wind light middle and later steering
S.W. fresh breezes from the S.W. with fog squalls

heading 1 under a double reef main top sail close reef fore and a reef fore sail
and spanker middle part 1 P.M. ship to the N.W. this part
strong breezes from the S.W. heading W by N with reef larger
and two reef in the top sails 3 A.M. set the fore sail hall
gill with wave reef in the main top sail 11 A.M. took in
the gill and double reef the main top sail Lat 55 1 Long 64 40

Monday Nov 26th Commences with heavy squalls from the
S.W. heading W and W by N. 1 P.M. set the gill 3 took it in
6 P.M. the reef out of the fore sail 3 P.M. heading W by N
middle and later part heading W by N 1 P.M. 11 A.M. set
sail cut wind S.W. Lat 56 34 Long 72 52

Tuesday Nov 27th Commences with fresh breezes from the S.W.
with squalls heading from W to W by N 3 P.M. all
sail out middle part heading W by N 3 A.M. tacked ship
heading S.W. this part in place in braking for water
in the main hatchway 11 A.M. heading W took in
the fore top gallant sail Lat 55 39 Long 76 13

Wednesday Nov 28th Commences with strong breezes from
the S.W. in place in steering of 11 half past 2
took in all the light sails 3 double reef the top sails
and took in the main sail 3 took in the gill 6 took
in the fore sail and close reef the fore top sail
middle and later wind from the S.W. heading S by W
Lat 56 03 Long 76 40

Thursday Nov 29th Commences with main wind from the
heading S by W 3 P.M. set the gill and main sail
wave reef out of the fore top sail 1 took in the gill and
main sail middle part squally heading S by W later
part set the mainsail Lat 56 34 Long 76 40
