Friday Feb 8th Commences with fresh breezes from the S.W.
this part in plogd in stowing of 7 P.M. wore ship of shore
Leamas baring E by the Suter. Middle part light and later
in plogd in stowing of the fore hole & 8 in spoke
the Starke Mary and Susan of New Bedford this part
Wind N.E.
Lat 44 35 Long

Saturday Feb 9 Commences with brisk breezes from the
N.W. the Watch in plogd in washing close sundown
took in Sail Leamas baring E by N. this part saw two
ships to windward middle part later part in plogd in ship
duty this part Wind N.E. blowing fresh took two reef
in the fore top sail and main took in the main sail
Lat 44 38 Long

Sunday Feb 10th Commences with fog & came down from
the mast heads half past 2 went up took in the gib in Spankie
& wore ship to the S.W. Wind N.W. Saw a sail on the Weather
vane middle part took in the fore top sail 5 E.M. Sat
it this part Wind from the Ward Lat 44 45 Long 76 21

Monday Feb 11th Commences with a heavy swell from the Ward
1 P.M. wore ship hedging to the Ship W middle and later
part fog and rain Wind from the N.W. hedging to
the N.E. in plogd in ship's duty Lat 44 24 Long 76 02

Tuesday Feb 12th Commences with the wind from the Ward
in plogd in braking out the water waft the fore hatch
3 P.M. let the reefs out of the main top sail & wore ship
hedging to N.W. middle and later part came this part in
plogd in braking out the between decks fore and aft
and stowing of
Lat 44 35 Long 75 33

Wednesday Feb 13th Commences with light airs and barres in plogd
in stowing of the between decks 1 P.M. hedging W.S.W.
saw the land baring E.S.E. 20 miles off middle and later part
came this part in plogd in stowing the pine wood in the aft
fore hole and fitting the gib panels Lat 44 47 Long 75 44

Thursday Feb 14th Commences with barres in plogd in putting on
Suntan lines on the main rigging & the land 15 miles off all
Sail out Leamas baring E.S.E. middle and later part in plogd
in ship's duty 5 A.M. made all sail hedging to the N.E.
Lat 44 47 Long 75 40 W.

Friday Feb 15th Commences with fresh breezes from the North
in plogd in Washing Ship aft Sundown saw hump backs
this part hedging W by N under short sail middle and
later part strong breezes from the N.W. in plogd in
ship's duty and so North Lat 44 33 Long 76 13 W.

Saturday Feb 16th Commences with strong breezes from the
N.W. & 1 P.M. commenced to wash ship under double
reef top sails Wind from the N.W.
Lat 44 45 Long 76 33 W.

Sunday Feb 17th Commences with strong breezes from
the N.W. this part in plogd in washing ship 6 P.M.
all down washed the decks of 6 P.M. the wind N.W.
had a heavy squall of rain hedging W.S.W. under
two double reef top sails and fore sail middle part
heavy squalls of rain later part half past 6 A.M.
saw sperm whales a going S by E 8 A.M.
heard two boats in per note blowing strong
from the N.E. 9 toward the third boat
half past 9 the port small struck and the
Whale stove the boat all to smash lost all out
the line took the crew to the ship and then went
back to the whale and turned him up half past
11 got him a long side blowing and raining hard
but could not haul him parted the line lost him
in a heavy rain squall ship under double reef
top sails gib and spankie
