N.W. heading S this part all hands in play in washing
Close Sundown wore ship to the N.W. middle part better fair
later in play in washing ship this part heading N.E.
Wind N.W. brisk breezes saw hump backs.
Lat 42 22 Long 75 03

Wednesday March 6th Commences with brisk breezes from
the N.W. 2 P m saw the ship of S.S. Carlos.
this part in play in washing ship snatching paddles and
fitting some of the boats over hat. 7 P m spoke the
Barke Helen Snow of New Bedford Bound home this part
heading in shore middle part standing off and on later

ting of water

the blubber room 100 barrels. the Captain in play
in buying potatoes and wood for trade 5 A m
bled all hands in fore sent in a raft and got
it of 6 9 barrels

in the fore hole on the Starboard side Sundown
Nock of work 6 A m thick fog 9 let up
All hands on shore to have a rope but sets crew
