two double reef top sails heading to the N^o E took
the boats up on the upper terraces middle and later part
Strong winds heading N^o E under two double reef top sails
Lat 19 22 Long 79 07

Wednesday May 22nd Commenced with Strong winds heading to
the N^o E under two double reef top sails with strong squalls and
rain middle part more moderate 7 P M in reef of W. W.
this part in ployd in Washing Ship Lat 18 56 Long 79 37

Thursday May 23rd Commenced with the winds more
moderate in ployd in Washing Ship 4 P M all threw
this part steering W S W 6 left by the wind heading
S by W under two double reef top sails and fore sail
middle and later part ship part moderate breezes
heading to the South in ployd in Ship duty Lat 19 12 Long 79 20 W

Friday May 24th Commenced with light winds this
part saw porpoises 4 P M tacked Ship heading
N by E W with all sail out Sundown took in sail
6 P M the St Spanker vang parted spliced it
and sent it up middle and later part this part in
ployd in Ship duty heading to the N E Lat 19 25 Long

Saturday May 25th Commenced with fresh winds all sail
out this part heading to the South Sailed a pin back
this part in ployd in fitting a Spanker vang Sundown
took in sail middle and later part in ployd in
Ship duty heading to the S with Strong winds
this part saw nothing Lat 19 Long 79

Cruising on the richer ground for sperm whales
Sunday May 26th Commenced with a hole top sail breeze
this part saw two pin backs 6 P M wore ship to the
N^o E the Cooper caught a Skip Packer middle and
later part fresh winds heading to the South
this part saw nothing Lat 19 06 Long 79 52

Monday May 27th Commenced with fresh winds heading to
the South saw a pin back 1 P M made sail more moderate at
five tacked Ship to the N E half past 5 took in the light
sails squally middle part squally later part 1 made
sail fresh winds the watch in ployd in Washing
Lat 19 17 Long 79 56

Tuesday May 28th Commenced with fresh winds heading
to the South this part saw two pin backs 6 P M
set the main sail all sail out heading South for compass
middle part all sail out heading to the South 7 A M
took in the light sails wore ship to the N E this part
in ployd in Ship duty Lat 19 47 Long 79 01

Wednesday May 29th Commenced with Strong winds
heading to the N E this part in ployd in Ship
duty Sundown wind backing with squalls middle and
later part fresh breezes heading to the N E in ployd
in Ship duty Lat 19 54 Long 79 14 W

Thursday May 30th Commenced with fresh winds
heading to the N E in ployd in Ship duty 3 P M
squally took in the light sails saw 3 pin backs
middle and later part 1 A M wore ship to the S
this part in ployd in stripping old junk for
spungarn Lat 19 27 Long 79 05

Friday May 31st Commenced with fresh winds
in ployd on the junk 5 P M took in the main sail
and two reef in the top sails heading to the South
middle and later part Strong winds in ployd in
Drawing varves saw Black fish
Lat 19 27 Long 79 57
