Bark Sappho of New Bedford. Captain Edward B Coffin master  
Sunday July 7<sup>th</sup> Commences with light airs from the N.W. & heading  
from S.E. to E. Saw fin backs breaching this part. Coiled a  
new line in the harbor boats but Sundown came took in  
sail middle and later part came 7 A.M. Saw a sail  
merchant man & sent a boat to him for papers it  
was the Ship Galeata of Boston from New York bound  
to California 110 Days out Lat 20 11 Long 72 20

Monday July 8<sup>th</sup> Commences with carries 3 P.M. light  
airs from the W. heading to the E. and saw two sail to  
the E. and middle part came 11 light airs from the  
W. this part. Sterd N.E. half past 6. Saw a  
Bark a down with three boats down in per suit of  
Whales. We tacked Ship and brought the boat on our  
Wether bow 8 A.M. Saw the whales a head of the boats  
coming per us. 9 toward two boats for them they  
headed to the W. N.W. Wind from the W. and light  
they were galled for the bark had struck and got  
home. We gave chase with 4 boats till they got out  
of site Lat 19 55 Long 72 02 W

Tuesday July 9<sup>th</sup> Commences with brisk breezes from  
the W. 1 P.M. got along side took the coats up  
bare Ship. Saw a brace of the Wether bow. Headed to  
the S.W. till 3 P.M. tacked Ship to the N.W. Saw  
the bark a cutting of the le quarter. Saw no  
more of the brace. Sundown took in sail this part  
saw three sails middle and later part this part  
saw fin backs all sail out Lat 12 20 Long 72 23

Wednesday July 10<sup>th</sup> Commences with brisk breezes from the  
South heading E by S 2 P.M. Saw a bark 3 points on  
the Wether bow this part. Saw fin backs. Sundown took in  
the light sails middle and later this part heading to the  
S. Saw 3 sail heading to the North Lat 19 40 Long 71 40

Thursday July 11<sup>th</sup> Commences with light trairs heading to the  
South line played in rattling the main top gallant rigging  
Sundown took in sail and wore ship to the N.E.  
middle and later part this part. Saw 4 sail bore a boyling  
A.C. running of Lat 18 45 Long 71 37 W.

A.C. running on the Archer ground for Sperm Whales  
Friday July 12<sup>th</sup> Commences with fresh trairs heading  
to the N.W. in played in Ships duty. Saw the bark  
& coupling of the le quarter 5 P.M. Sundown took in sail  
middle and later part light trairs with shuddles  
heading to the South Lat 19 41 Long 71 45

Saturday July 13<sup>th</sup> Commences with light breezes heading  
to the S.E. Saw a sail of the beam and wore forward of  
the Wether from this part in played in rattling the fore  
top gallant rigging this part all sail out middle part head-  
ing to the S.E. with all sail out later part 6 A.M. tacked  
Ship to the N.E. this part. Saw fin backs Lat 20 10 Long 71 01

Sunday July 14<sup>th</sup> Commences with fresh trairs heading  
to the North this part all sail out. Swallow. Sundown  
saw a sail 4 points of the le bow and saw a flock  
run for it but saw nothing in it. Left by the wind  
and took in sail middle and later part 5 A.M. tacked  
Ship to the S. Saw a sail of the le beam Lat 19 27 Long 70 42

Monday July 15<sup>th</sup> Commences with strong trairs head-  
ing to the S. Saw fin backs and Sulphur bottoms a  
breaching and making bright water. Sundown wore  
Ship to the North middle and later part 10 A.M. tacked  
Ship to the S. All sail out Lat 19 53 Long 70 45

Tuesday July 16<sup>th</sup> Commences with brisk trairs heading  
to the South 5 P.M. Saw a sail of the Wether bow. Sun-  
down took in the light sails middle and later part  
7 P.M. Sprak the Anconda. later part heading to  
the South. Anconda of the le quarter 3 miles off  
Lat 19 50 Long 70 52

Wednesday July 17<sup>th</sup> Commences with fresh trairs head-  
ing S.E. this part. Saw a fin back. Sundown wore Ship  
to the North. The Anconda of the le beam 12 miles off  
middle and later part this part (light trairs) head-  
ing to the North. Saw a sail a Stern  
Lat 19 33 Long 70 37 W.
