Friday Aug 23rd Commenced with strong breezes heading to the
N^o E 3 Pm Saw a Sail of the weather beam heading to the S
1 Pm more moderate Sundown wore ship and took in sail
making to the Southern middle and later part 1. Saw the
Ship lander part two windward this part Strong breezes
Lat 1938 Long 90 41

Saturday Aug 24th Commenced with strong breezes this part
in play in fitting the over head boat Sundown wore
Ship heading to the N^o E with hard squalls two double reef
top sails middle and later part 7 A m wore ship to the S
Saw a sail a head and none of the quarter 9 A m
took in the gill and spanker Lat 1941 Long 90 41 1/2

Sunday Aug 25th Commenced with strong breezes under
double reef top sails 5 Pm Saw the sail heading towards
us with her fore top sail in Sundown wore ship to the
N^o E middle and later part strong breezes 6 A m wore
Ship to the South this part the lander part two
Wind out of us this part saw nothing Lat 1944 Long 90 41 1/2

Monday Aug 26th Commenced with strong breezes heading to the
S under double reef top sails gill and spanker Sundown
wore ship to the N^o E middle part moderate later
part 6 A m made all sail this part heading to the S E
Saw three sail Lat 1957 Long 90 40 1/2

Tuesday Aug 27th Commenced with light airs from the
N^o W head to the E ord 5 Pm wore middle and
later part this part heading to the North with light airs from
the W N W Saw a part a stern Lat 1957 Long 90 40 1/2

Wednesday Aug 28th
Commenced with light airs from the W N W heading N^o E W
With all sail out half past 1 Saw breeches two points ahead of
the weather beam 12 miles of half past 3 Saw the spouts with
the glass from the mast head towards fore boats and went in
per side of them and pulled till Sundown ungave them up
never saw them out of the boats pulled about 5 miles
5 Pm got on board Rupp all sail on and Steer N^o W

Trading on the other ground for Sperm Whales
later part Wind light from the N^o E Steering N^o W by W
but River saw nothing more of the whales Lat 1927
Long 91 01

Thursday Aug 29th Commenced with light breezes from
the N^o E this part Steering from W up to S but saw
nothing Sundown took in sail heading N^o E Wind
N E middle and later part this part fresh breezes
Lat 1955 Long 90 34

Friday Aug 30th Commenced with fresh breezes heading to the S
2 Pm touched Ship to the N^o E this part Saw a pinback
Sundown took in sail middle and later part Strong
breezes under double reef top sails Lat 20 03 Long 90 34

Saturday Aug 31st Commenced with strong breezes from
the S E 4 Pm wore ship to the N^o E 4 Pm spoke
the bark Heckerlee of New Bedford some whale this
breeze middle and later part strong breezes Ship under
double reef top sails heading to the S Lat 1956 Long 90 13

Sunday September 1st Commenced with strong breezes
under double reef top sails 2 Pm backed Ship to the
N^o E Saw nothing Sundown took in the gill and spanker
middle and later part strong breezes heading to the S E
10 A m wore ship to the S under double top sails
Lat 1946 Long 90 04

Monday Sep 2nd Commenced with strong breezes
heading to the S this part Saw a pin back Sundown
wore ship to the N^o E and took in the gill and spanker
middle and later part 2 A m lay with the main yard
a back 6 Pm wore ship heading to the South
8 A m Saw a large whale a going N^o W Ship under double
reef top sails toward 4 boats for him and gave chase
all of this part Lat 1946 Long 90 04

Tuesday Sep 3rd Commenced with strong breezes 6 Pm
the west boat struck and the whale held him over
board and Carbond struck him and turned him up 5 Pm
got him to the ship and the floater rope on
Lat 1946 Long 90 04
