the N.W. heading to the W. under double reef top sails
the morning light of the 6 quarter 4 P.M. took in the fore
top sail. W. was too much for the main right under double
reef top sails middle part reef the fore sail later part 6 A.M.
hull of and out of the reef and set the fore top sail blowing strong
from the S.W. 10 Saw the land a light tree Lat 43 24 Long 75 10

Saturday Dec 28th Commences with strong breezes from the
N.W. 3 P.M. moderate set the gill and spanker 1 P.M.
wind W.W. light thick part saw grasses and hump backs
3 P.M. gusty breeze 6 P.M. compass middle part moderate
later part wind N.W. steering S. Lat 43 23 Long 75 0

Sunday Dec 29th Commences with strong breezes from the
N.W. running of this part saw Sulpher bottom 3 P.M. saw the
morning light running of the land middle part. Wind N.W.
later part thick overcast weather saw nothing

Monday Dec 30th Commences with the wind from the
N.W. thick fog 1 wire ship heading to the S.W. under two
double top sails middle part thick fog 5 A.M. lit up
with a fair wind N.W. made all sail this part saw
plenty of porpoises Lat Long

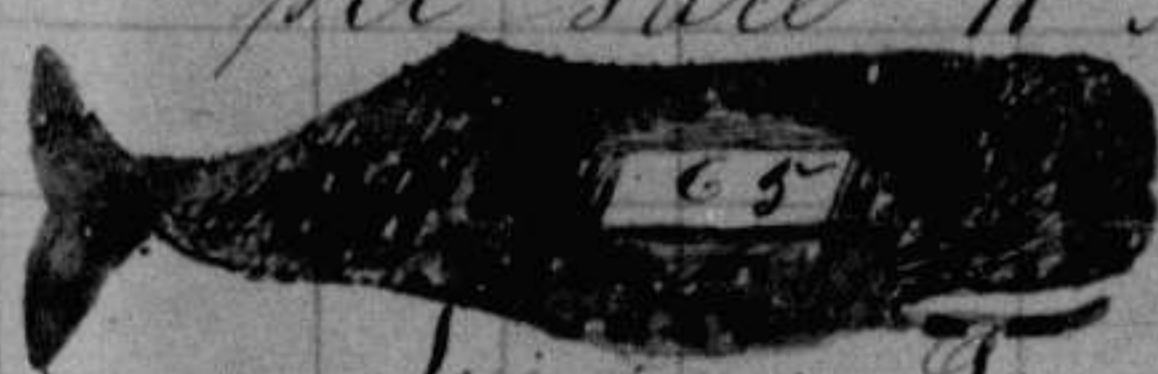
Tuesday Dec 31st Commences with brisk breezes from the
N.W. heading in saw porpoises and a Sulphur bottom.
Sundown Jacked ship of shore and took in the light sails
head rig W middle part thick and rainy later part
wind N.W. and clear fine weather but saw nothing
steering S for the land made all sail
Lat 43 43 Long 75

Cruising of guano for Sperm Whales January 1st 1862
Wednesday Jan 1st Commences with brisk breezes from the N.W.
this part steering both fine weather but saw nothing Sulphur
bottom Sundown took in sail middle part squally later
part wind N.W. with squalls of rain this part saw hump backs
Lat Long

Thursday Jan 2nd Commences with strong breezes 4 P.M.
wind S.W. blowing strong with squalls double reef the top sails
6 P.M. saw a sail 100 points on the weather saw with our
head yards a back 7 wore round of shore middle part blow-
ing hard from the S.W. with hail squalls later part...
8 A.M. saw the morning light showing a whale of
shore 9 got hooked on heavy squalls Lat 43 22 Long 75 05

Friday Jan 3rd Commences with strong breezes from the S.W.
this part saw 3 sail 7 P.M. the west end bearing
E.S.E. and 1 end S.E. by E middle part moderate
later part light breezes from the S.W.
Lat 43 30 Long 75 11

Saturday Jan 4th Commences with light breezes from
the S.W. this part all sail 10 P.M. saw the
morning light of the 6 P.M. carrying a back whale
run for our starboard left in and took in sail
supposed her to have a mother whale and saw the
right run in for her middle part light air from
the N.W. later part 4 P.M. saw sperm whales
18 going S.E. 10 toward 14 boats and went in
per date 11 A.M. the barbed boat struck
Lat Long



Sunday Jan 5th Commences with the wind N.W. 1 P.M.
got the whale to the ship the other boats came
on board gave up the chase this part in playd
in but in middle part nock of later in playd

Monday Jan 6th Commences with the wind backing
and drizzling this part in playd in sail the last
3 P.M. the capture of the morning light came on board
8 P.M. of this part in playd in backing head
middle and later in playd in backing head wind
N.W. the land 12 miles of Lat 43 27 Long
