Tuesday Jan 7th Commenced with the wind from the SSW with a Squall of rain this part in playd on the head 1 Pm commenced on the head 1 Pm wind light from the WSW under double reef top sails middle and later part in playd in boyling this part saw 3 sail two a sailing
Lat 43° 10' Long 75° 11'

Wednesday Jan 8th Commenced with light breezes from the S heading in in playd in boyling 3 Pm made all sail 7 Pm wind from the WSW and bearing SSE middle part in playd in boyling 4 A.M. all down later part strong breezes from the WSW saw 4 sail Lat Long

Thursday Jan 9th Commenced with strong breezes from the WSW in playd in washing close 7 Pm bore ship and took in the fore top sail the morning light on the water beam with her fore top sail in middle part rainy later part 6 A.M. in playd in braking out in the after hole for running oil in the ground Lat Long

Friday Jan 10th Commenced with the wind from the North all this part rain in playd in slowing down 11 Pm all three blowing strong took in the fore top sail 6 Wind hauled to the SW and blew strong middle and later part this part made all sail saw two sail Lat Long

Saturday Jan 11th Commenced with the wind from the N.W. 5 Pm thick and rainy took in sail middle and later this part wind N.W. thick spoke the ripl of New London Lat Long

Sunday Jan 12th Commenced with the wind N.W. 5 Pm spoke the morning light this part wind light breezes later part half past 5 saw a school of sperm whales in shore a going to the Sutherland the morning light on our water beam toward 4 boats and who toward three and held up for them. She had the chance none of her boats struck the others went over the SSW did two winders who gave chase till she lost sight of them none got on board Lat 43° 31' Long 75° 23'

Monday Jan 13th Commenced with breezes all sail on the morning light in playd in cutting Sun down upstid her fore top sail up this part came middle part and later this part a North Star ing S by W and S by E for Venus Lat 44° 37' Long

Tuesday Jan 14th Commenced with a North 1 Pm took in the fore top sail blowing heavy 7 Pm hauled two the WSW and lit up much of raining bare ship to the SW middle part Wind N.W. Sat the fore top sail later part the same with hail squalls and blowing strong 10. kept at N.E. Lat 44° 53' Long 76° 27'

Wednesday Jan 15th Commenced with the wind N.W. Staring E.N.E. for Venus 1 Pm saw it 5 A.M. kept the wind to the N.W. 7 Pm the land bearing S by E middle part moderate later part 6 A.M. began to blow from the N.W. 11 took in the gib and spanker Lat Long

Thursday Jan 16th Commenced with a gail from the N.W. this part heading of shore WSW land 30 miles of this part under a double reef main top sail and fore sail main spencer and fore top mast stay set. middle part moderate later part main sail wind N.W. this part Staring N.E. Lat Long

Friday Jan 17th Commenced with the wind N.W. 1 Pm thick this part saw Sulpher botoms 1 Pm blowing fresh from the N.W. took in the fore top sail (going under short sail saw plenty of porpoises middle part heavy squalls of rain from the N.W. later part 6 A.M. Sat the fore top sail blowing strong Lat Long

Saturday Jan 18th Commenced with strong wind from the N.W. with squalls 11 Pm cleared of Wind SW heading N.W. saw Venus a Stern middle and later part 6 A.M. of graps saw the morning light and the ship in tropa this part fog squalls Lat Long
