Friday Mar 1st Commences with light breezes from the SSW Steering E by S 2 Pm Saw Sperm whales 40 Points of the Le Bour Howard two boats for them too but then of their men a going quick two minutes the warboard boat got with in 10 boats length of them the went down a never saw more out of the boats wind light with a heavy sheet on gave them up and came up to bed Sundown guapo having 6 S & W point took in the light sails middle and later part Strong breezes from the SSW this part Steering of two the North Saw hump backs Lat Long

Saturday Mar 2nd Commences with strong breezes from the SSW Steering of two the North Sundown heading of Shore middle and later part Strong breezes from the SSW 7 Am Steering S & Wind W & N Lat 43 32 Long

Sunday Mar 3rd Commences with fresh breezes from the W & N 1 Pm left by the wind two the S & 3 thick fog and rain lit up this part under double reef top sails heading S & 30 miles from guapo middle part Wind dropping thick and foggy later part the same Wind from SW two P & W Lat Long

Monday Mar 4th Commences with the Wind W & N rain and fog light airs heading two the SW under hole top sails Sundown back Ship heading S & W thick and foggy middle part moderate later part 5 Am made sail 6 Am Saw a sail this part Wind W & N 10 Am spoke the Ship John Cog Saw out of S & barless Lat Long

Tuesday Mar 5th Commences with fresh breezes from the W & N heading two the SW 3 Pm took in the fly gill and gaff top sail half past 3 the cap tin came on board and dable reef the top sails breezing on 6 took in the fore top sail and the rear and waist boat on the upper beams middle and later part moderate gail from the North this part heading two the North and Word Lat 42 54 Long 15 46 W

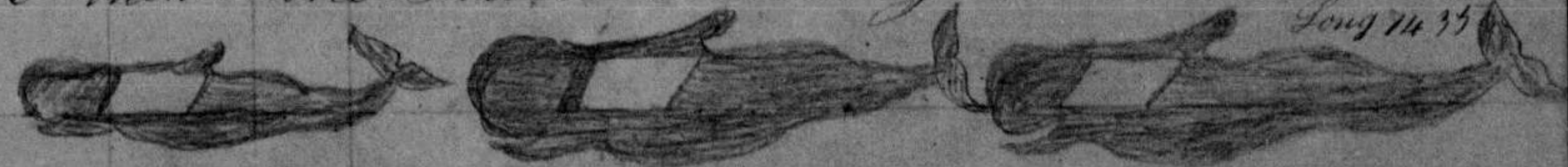

Wednesday Mar 6th Commences with Strong Winds from the North heading two the North 5 Pm Saw porpoises and A plenty of Birds middle part Strong breezes from the W & N 12 More ship of Shore heading SW by N later part under double reef top sails Saw a sail heading in Lat 42 40 Long 16 24 W

Thursday Mar 7th Commences with Strong breezes from the W & N heading SW by N under double reef top sails middle and later part Wind light from the W & N 10 Saw a sail of the S & N Lat 42 30 Long 16 20

Friday Mar 8th Commences with light breezes from the W & N heading two the North 5 Pm a brisk breeze S & E Steering P & E with all sail out middle and later part Squalls of rain with heavy claps of thunder with sharp lightning 3 Am wind South Steering P & E Lat 43 13 Long 15 06

Saturday Mar 9th Commences with light breezes from the South Steering P & E this part Sent the fore top gallant down and mended it and bent it 4 Pm light airs from the South 1 Pm Steering S per compass middle part Wind light dropping heading P & E later part it looked Ship two the SW 11 Saw black fish toward 4 boats for them the Starboard boat got three Lat 40 43 Long 14 35 W



Sunday Mar 10th Commences with light breezes from the S & W this part in playd in clearing away the black fish middle and later part Strong breezes from the S & W heading two the Word Lat 40 42 Long 15 07 W

Monday Mar 11th Commences with Strong breezes from the S & W heading two the Word under double reef top sails middle part took in the fore top sail blowing got and spanker later part 3 Am more ship and Word 1 Pm made sail Wind S & W this part in playd in minding black fish cluster Lat 40 11 Long 15 23 W
