Monday May 26th Commences with light breezes from the S.E.
steering S.W. by S. with all sail out this part saw
porpises middle and later part light breezes from the S.E.
Lat 20 54 Long 81 01 W.

Tuesday May 27th Commences with light breezes from the
S.W. heading S.W. Saw a sail running of middle and later part
fresh breezes heading W. by S. Saw a sail Lat 20 52 Long 82 58

Wednesday May 28th Commences with fresh breezes from the
S.W. heading from W. to W.S.W. all sail out this part in
play in cleaning the state rooms and killing bed bugs

middle and later part light breezes from the S.W. steering

Saturday May 31st Commences with calms in play
in banding a fore top sail and fore sail and main
top sail made the others up and stowed in the sail pen
middle and later part light breezes from the S.E. steering
S.W. by W. light squalls of rain saw pin backs 9 P.M.
Lat 22 51 Long 84 11 W.

Sunday June 1st Commences with fresh breezes from the

saw fine middle part middle and later part heading
S.E. steering S.W. by W. Saw a sail three points on the weather
bow Lat 22 36 Long 85 24

Monday June 2nd Commences with fresh breezes from the

later on spoke her she steering W. by S. middle and
later part Wind S.E. 1 P.M. spoke a ship from
