the Sackent mate Mr. Brown told him when he came on
deck 3 o'clock to keep of the vice bench and stand his
watch and he said he would not do it he set down
when ever he was a mind and lay down and he could not
make stand his watch in going down the gang way
so the Sackent mate to suck his ass and the Sackent
mate came down to the Cap. tin and told him that
Gillaspie had given him the Cap. tin and mate
Went on deck and i told him to come up and he said he
would not come for me he would come for the Cap. tin
so he came up and in coming up the Sackent mate
struck him with a stick and mock him back but he
came up and Cap. tin Coffin gave him his orders and let
him go he had a hole cut in his hat 3 A.M. when
the watch was call he was the first man on deck aft
the Cap. tin was in the Starboard boat when he went forward
the Sackent mate went forward to call off the watch

at 5 P.M. spoke the Commodore mores and the Henry
Tuber this part rain squalls ship haling S & E by it
middle and later part Strong winds haling to the
South this part Saw the cutter and the Cap. tin
Went on board and got the letters noon. Lat 19 17
