 Double reef top Sails 1 Pm found the fore stay gone in the
 splice of the collar And the lower bolt of the Aft
 back stay on the larboard side broke of it look as if it had
 been broken a long time got a tassel on it this part saw
 1/2 Sail middle and later part Strong winds under double
 reef top Sails Lat 19 54 Long 11 03

Monday Aug 25 Commences with Strong winds under
 double reef top Sails heading to the Sutherland 4 Pm were
 ship to the N.E. saw 1/2 Sail middle and later part
 more moderate let the reef out of the main top Sail
 1/2 and Spanker this part saw her Sail Lat 19 47
 Long 11 07

 Tuesday Aug 26 Commences with fresh winds and over
 cast weather this part heading to the Sutherland 4 Pm were
 ship to the N.E. dark took in 1/2 Sail middle and later part
 fresh winds this part let the main sail 1/2 took it in
 this part heading to the Sutherland Lat 19 53 Long 11 05

 Wednesday Aug 27 Commences with Strong winds
 this part heading to the N.E. middle and later part
 Strong winds under double reef top Sails heading to the
 Sutherland this part saw her Sail on the weather quarter
 Lat 19 44 Long 11 06

the
 Thursday Aug 28 Commences with Strong winds heading
 to the Sutherland under double reef top Sails 4 Pm were ship to
 the N.E. saw 1/2 Sail on the weather side middle and later
 8 A.m spoke the bark Thetis the Captain went on board
 to get a bolt for the fore top mast back stay but they
 had none this part Strong winds Lat 19 47 Long 11 07

Friday Aug 29 Commences with Strong winds under double
 reef top Sails heading to the Sutherland 4 Pm were ship to the N.E.
 middle and later part more moderate made Sail saw her
 Sail when with her main top Sail down and the other with
 her fore top Sail down Lat 19 56 Long 11 09

travelling on the Arthur ground for Sperm Whales
 Saturday Aug 30th Commences with brisk breezes with a hole
 main top Sail fly, gill and gaff top Sail this part in play
 in making out in the 11 foreen decks for a tassel of sail
 to get a tassel of light canvas this part heading to the N.E.
 middle and later part brisk breezes this part making out
 for sails and parceling the blue corns Lat 19 44 Long 11 07

the
 Sunday Aug 31 Commences with light winds half
 past 12 hauld up the main Sail for the tangle the Captain
 Winton board and got a bolt for the back stay 4 Pm all
 done and set up and the pipes of bread hoop and sled back
 5 Pm saw Spout in a Squall about the Sun Glade held
 them sperm whales toward 11 boats for them that proved
 to be killers came on board this part wing light

middle and later part wind light main all Sail heading
 to the Sutherland fine weather saw 3 Sail Lat 19 44 Long 11 09

the
 Monday Sep 1 Commences with light winds and
 Pleasant weather All Sail out heading South 5 Pm
 saw a ship to windward under 3 boats but saw nothing
 middle and later part light breezes this part in play in
 mending the main top Sail heading to the Sutherland
 Lat 20 00 Long 11 15

the
 Tuesday Sep 2 Commences with light winds Strong
 1/2 by 11 4 Pm got the main top Sail down and bent
 this part in play in mending the meet out of two back
 Sun down took in Sail and left to the wind to the N.E.
 middle and later part fresh winds it took the reef in
 the fore top Sail saw a bunch of the 11 fore run for it
 proved to be a fine back Lat 19 54 Long 11 15

 Wednesday Sep 3 Commences with fresh winds this part
 heading to the N.E. 5 Pm saw porpoises a going to wind
 middle and later part Strong winds heading to the Sutherland
 under double reef top Sails Lat 19 55 Long 11 16

 Thursday Sep 4 Commences with Strong winds under
 double reef top Sails this part heading to the N.E. saw nothing
 middle and later part more moderate under double reef
 top Sails heading to the South this part saw two
 school of porpoises Lat 19 55 Long 11 17
