Saturday Ap 25th Commences with light breezes from the
North Starboard watch on shore and the rest on duty
1 P m came off this part all hands on board in playd
in Ships duty light breezes from the North

Sunday Ap 26th Commences with light breezes from the North
in playd in Ships duty 3 P m took up the Cask of oil

1 P m let a watch go in for a sun sight and later part
this part Wind from the North took in 11 A m let
a part of the crew go on shore for a run

Monday Ap 27th Commences with a further the Captain
on board 1 P m blowing fresh with rain Sun of the Ships
with the Starboard anchor down middle and later part

has sail in playd in Ships duty 1 P m Commenced a run
1 P m blowing fresh from the North Slacked down the Shant
penter and let the Starboard anchor hang to the Cat had all
ready for setting go if wanted lying with 11 P m
of chain in 3 fathoms in Cape Horn side middle and later
part in playd in Ships duty

Friday May 1st Commences with light breezes from the North
1 P m Wind from the North Arnolda came too down with
the rest Ships all ready for waiting for men and water
to get out middle and later part this part took the
ghost of the night dawns and rove the Cat fall

Saturday May 2nd Commences with breezes and good not sail
this part Ship all clear and Captain on board it being calm
sent the govt top sail down and repaired it and sent
it up 1 P m Calm middle and later part Wind
from the North Wind bound

Sunday May 3rd Commences with the Wind from the North
still Wind bound 1 P m the mail Steamer came with the
mail middle and later part 10 A m hoisted short
and made sail and took the anchor Wind light from
the North got clear of the Ships and did out Calm

Monday May 4th Commences with a flat Calm
1 P m light breezes from the North Stearing down the bay
The Peru and China came also and the old Maria came
to two ma half past six the black rocks of the Starboard
quarter half mile off Wind light from South took the
Starboard anchor on the bow for the night weather fine
a full moon and clear middle and later part fresh breezes
this part in playd in Stowing the anchors and lashing
them and Stowing the chains
