south half past 12 saw a bark hove to under a blast reef top sail
hiding to the Word 1 P.m. set the main top gallant sail
this part running hole by sails fore sail and main top gallant sail
middle part fresh breezes from the south 12 middle part dark
N.W. this part snow squalls till 11 A.m. then lit up with
S.W. this part got a latitude Lat 56 15 Long 63 32 11th

Friday May 22nd Commences with fresh breezes from the
S.W. Staring N.W. by E with all sail out middle part
sail on that will drag middle part fresh breezes from the
Word Staring N.W. by E 8 A.m. Stared N.E. by N with

part strong breezes 6 A.m. hauled to the N.W.
