

Monday  
Oct 5<sup>th</sup>

Bark Sarah J. Matthews  
Commences with fine weather. Light airs  
from S. W. Middle part moderate.  
Latter part strong breeze from E. S. E.

Tuesday  
Oct 6<sup>th</sup>

This twenty four hours commences with  
strong breezes from the Eastward One o'clock  
P. M. Capt Hensley sent off an anchor and  
chain which was dropped 45 fathoms ahead  
of our bark. Took the cable to the bark  
hove up our anchor cleared it from an old  
chain which we hooked up Then slipped from  
the shore anchor and stood out of the harbor  
Latter part strong breeze from the same quarter  
Ship Laying off and on between Peice and Sagal  
under whole topsails No observations

Wednesday  
Oct 7<sup>th</sup>

Commences with whole topsail  
breeze Ship off Sagal Three o'clock Capt  
Hensley came on board Run down to the south-  
ward of Sagal and luffed to under stow-  
te reefed topsails wind light Latter part  
light variable airs Ship fifteen miles to  
the westward of Peice The watch empl-  
oyed in fletting water coaks from forward  
to the main hatch

Thursday  
Oct 8<sup>th</sup>

This twenty four hours commences  
with a light breeze from the Eastward  
Ship on the eastern southern tack, spoke  
the bark Kothchile Latter part wind  
light from N. E. Ship steering S. S. E.  
with all sail out The watch employed  
in breaking out and trimming ship  
Took a M. saw a spout run for  
it but saw it not again

Friday Oct 9<sup>th</sup> This day begins with  
strong breezes from N. N. W. Ship steering  
S. S. E. with all sail out Latter part wind  
strong from N. N. E. Ship steering S. S. E. under all  
sail The watch employed in repacking and salting  
a lot of beef marketed Bonderico Lat by obs 34.46

Saturday Oct 10<sup>th</sup>

Long by chron 26.00  
commences with strong gales from the N. E. Ship steering  
south by East under all sail Latter part wind  
more moderate Ship steering South half west  
with all sail out The watch employed in  
painting and fitting on of the boats over head

Lat by obs 32.30  
Long by chron 24.55

Sunday Oct 11<sup>th</sup>

This twenty four hours begins with  
moderate breezes and a heavy swell running  
from the N. Ship steering South half West with  
all sail out Latter part nice whole sail  
breeze from the N. Ship steering S. Spoke a  
porpoise and spoke the Kothchile Lat 31.01

Monday Oct 12<sup>th</sup>

Begin with fine weather Ship  
steering South with all sail out Latter  
part moderate breeze from the N. Ship  
steering S. by W. with all sail out The watch  
employed in painting boats Lat by obs 29.21

Long by chron 24.07

Tuesday Oct 13<sup>th</sup>

This twenty four hours begins with  
light breezes from N. N. E. Ship steering as  
mentioned above (Caught a porpoise) Latter part  
weather the same Spoke the Kothchile The  
watch employed in changing the fore spencer  
for a main spencer Cut up the old main  
spencer Shot a ball into a finback  
shale but he carried it off very quietly
