 Saturday Oct 24th Weather mild as usual
 sent on shore 5 barrels of back beef
 took on board another raft of water
 also some goats and a few more pigs
 Latter part fine weather, took
 in the old waist boat also took
 on board more fruit the second and
 third mate on shore

Sunday Oct 25 This twenty four hours fine
 weather ship lying at anch in nine
 fathoms of water One man sick and
 off duty Latter part good weather all
 hands on board

Monday Oct 26th Fine breeze from the Eastward
 ship lying the same as before mentioned
 at about 4 AM took the anchor and stood
 off shore Capt Handy came on board and
 kept off South wind N E also came
 on board three men to replace our runar
 - off one of the three is ship's boatster
 Land bearing north E 30 m dist

Tuesday Oct 27 This twenty four hours commen-
 ces with light breeze from N E
 ship steering South with all sail
 Middle and Latter the same the watch
 employed in righting up what was misplaced
 in port boatswain rigging their boats
 turned up and painted the starboard boat
 knocked the rust off the anchors
 and turned them

 with moderate breeze from N E ship steering
 South under all sail One sail in sight
 Middle and Latter part strong breeze from
 the Eastward ship steering South with all
 sail out

 with hard weather wind light from the
 Eastward, middle part thunder squalls
 from all quarters Middle part the
 same Latter part more mild with occas-
 ional rain squalls

 with veritable wind and rain squalls ship
 steering S, middle part windy the northward
 Latter part calm and light veritable air
 Two sail in sight

 with calms Bent a new jib and commenced
 repairing the old one. Ship steering South when
 she can Latter part the same the watch
 employed in overhauling the onions

 with light breeze from E S E ship on the
 port tack with all sail out Middle
 part the same Latter part nearly
 calm spoke the Bark Bothisheld
