 hours begins with fine weather
 wind from NE Ship on the starbo-
 ard tack heaving N.W. three o'clock
 P.M. took ship heaving E.S.E.
 three sail in sight, one steamer
 Mitchell and latter part light
 variable airs. Spoke the brig Polisson
 3 days from Boston bound to Washington
 Lat 58 01
 Long 13.00

Thursday June 16th This twenty four hours
 begins with light airs from the
 Northward and soon hauls out
 to the westward Mitchell part
 wind more strong. Spoke another
 brig latter part wind strong from
 the Westward ship steering N.W.
 with all sail out 4 o'clock P.M.
 lowered for black fish and
 got one
 Lat 59 50
 Long 12 06

Friday June 17th Commences with light
 breeze from the S.W. ship steering
 N.W. under all sail Mitchell
 part light variable winds latter
 strong breeze from N.E.
 ship on the port tack with all
 sail out 10 o'clock A.M. took
 ship heaving N.E. of E Lat 40 36
 Long 11 23

of Weatherford
 Saturday June 18th This twenty four hours
 commences with strong gales from
 N.E. ship under double reefed
 topsails and courses 3 P.M. spoke
 a N.E. pilot boat 4 P.M. passed
 block Island bearing N.E. of E Mac
 long Island in sight Mitchell and lat
 the calm Caught a sword fish

Sunday June 19th This day commences with calm
 weather 1 o'clock P.M. took a light breeze
 from S.W. ship steering N.E. of E block
 Island bearing N.W. 12 miles distant
 Mitchell part the weather the same
 ship steering into the bay Day light
 ship off N. by E half part five took
 a harbour pilot
