

Thursday October the 27 This Twenty
four hours commensis with rapid
weather commensal cutting at 4
o'clock and finished at dark
middle part blew hard water-busy
cutting up blubber latter part
blowing very very sea could not
boil Lat 40 00 Long 55 15

Friday Oct 28 This Twenty four hours
commensis with very weather very
gale wind held to N 44 very
spals and very sea gut all the
blubber in the blubber room in
casks middle part blew very very
latter part moderated cut up
the lead and started the corks
Lat 39 50 Long 48 10

Saturday Oct 29 This twenty four hours
commensis with light winds from
North all hands busy boiling
middle part strong winds from
S 44 latter part finished boiling
Lat 40 20 Long 49 00

Sunday Oct 30 This Twenty four hours
commensis with fine spals cleared
up the the decks at six o'clock
took in four and main topsail
latter part set them a gain exposed
to corks Lat 39 50 Long 48 16

Monday Oct 31 This Twenty four
commensis with spaly weather
Stead down our oil four
casks at three o'clock P.M.
Saw whale gut our boats
red by board starboard boat chest
then til dark whales gird pick
with out success middle part fine
wind east latter part rainy wind
clear round the compass Lat

Tuesday November the 1 This Twenty
four hours commensis with wind from N 44
Ship heading N 44 spaly and plenty
of rain middle part fine weather wind the
same latter part most calm sent down the
main topsail to main side and from
south east Lat 38 15 Long 50 11

Wednesday Nov 2 This Twenty four hours
commensis with very spals 4 44 took the
main topsail into the cabin to mend
bent the old war took in the four topsail
lost right the main heading N 44 44
middle part very spals from S 44
with thunder and lightning
latter part wind held round to
the Nor Nor West blowing strong
Long 50 20

Thursday November 3 This Twenty four hours
commensis very spals filled fearsail
and main topsail it blowing
very very from North West very
sea Ship trying to heading to
the west at twelve o'clock or
thereabouts a Sea Struck
hur low and started cutwater
and stem we cap of before the
wind and gut the chane round
the stem to turn threw the top pipes
and took it to the windless here it
staid and to turn of cutting fel
round the cut water and held it
tost with tables the decks full of water
most all the time took the pump the mate
some water sent down topgallant
yards middle part blew very very and
a very very sea latter part it it Laid
down main some sail heading west
some rain and sail Lat 37 20 Long 50 22

Struck by heavy sea
