

Remarks on Board Bark Sarah B. Hall 1877

Wednesday Oct 17

This day begins with strong winds from the north west with squally weather ship steering east by south under double reef top sails and fore sail
Lat 35-20 N Long 42-33 W
saw one new boat full nothing in sight

Thursday Oct 18

This day begins with a strong gale from the south west with squally weather ship steering south east by south under two double reef top sails no sun to day saw one fin back

Friday Oct 19

This day begins with strong winds from the south west with squally weather ship steering south east by south under double reef top sails no sun to day

Saturday Oct 20

This day begins with light winds from the north west with clear weather ship steering south east by south under all sail
Lat 35-23 N Long 34-22 W
employed broking for lumber saw black fish towed three boats but with out success

Remarks on Board Bark Sarah B. Hall 1877

Sunday Oct 21

This day begins with light winds from the north west with clear weather middle part the same latter part calm ship going round and round
Lat 34-58 N Long 33-42 W
one ship in sight

Monday Oct 22

This day begins with light winds from south east and eastward with foggy weather ship headed to the south east at four PM with ship heading to the north and east under all sail
Lat 34-35 N Long 33-09 W
employed four in the starboard boat and put the shore boat out with painter making a gangway board rope making a line with rope
saw a number of vessels to day all going to the northward and eastward

Tuesday Oct 23

This day begins with light winds from the south east and eastward ship heading to the northward eastward under all sail
Lat 34-55 N Long 32-20 W
employed over holding the boat blocks and fitting the rigging a number of ships in sight and one fin back

Wednesday Oct 24

This day begins with light winds from the north west with clear weather ship heading to the eastward under all sail
Lat 34-03 N Long 30-32 W
employed fitting the rigging and broke out water a number of ships in sight and one fin back
