

## Remarks on Board Bark Sarah S. Hale 1847

Tuesday Nov 27

This day begins with strong south east trade winds with pleasant weather ship steering south under all sail  
 Lat 11-00 S Long 29-14 W  
 employed fitting the rigging and making  
 boat sails saw one ship east small white  
 water

Wednesday Nov 28

This day begins with pleasant south east trade winds with pleasant weather ship steering south by east under all sail  
 Lat 10-00 S Long 29-00 W  
 employed fitting the rigging nothing in sight to day

Thursday Nov 29

This day begins with strong winds from the north north east with pleasant weather ship steering south by west under all sail  
 Lat 10-15 S Long 29-10 W  
 employed nothing down the fore top mast rigging and bent fore and main stay sail nothing in sight to day

Friday Nov 30

This day begins with strong winds from the north with squally weather ship steering south by west at two o'clock P.M. changed the course to south south west under all sail  
 Lat 9-50 S Long 29-07 W  
 employed fitting the rigging made new gaskets for the stowage but broke out water saw two ships to day

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Saturday Dec 1

This day begins with strong winds from the east with squally weather ship steering south by west under all sail  
 Lat 10-35 S Long 29-32 W  
 employed scrubbing ship, rain most all day killed two hogs to day

Sunday Dec 2

This day begins with strong north east winds with squally weather at daylight raised the fore top of the main deck a few twenty miles off at eleven o'clock P.M. lowered two boats to go fishing brought two leather jackets ash but shells were gone three hogs came ash wet and hungry made sail on the ship steering south by west under all sail

Monday Dec 3

This day begins with strong winds from the north east with squally weather ship steering south by west under all sail  
 Lat 10-35 S Long 29-35 W  
 employed setting up four top mast back stays  
 One ship in sight to day

Tuesday Dec 4

This day begins with strong winds from the north east with squally weather ship steering south south west under all sail at six P.M. took in the fore top de solent sail and dished up the fore top sail and fished the main reef supplied mashing board mat no son to day nothing in sight to day
