

Remarks on Board Bark Sarah B. Feb 1877

Thursday Dec 13

this day begins with a light breeze from the north north west with foggy weather ending with a calm shift steering different courses under both top sails but several took in both double reef top sails no sun to day employed sailing down the coast, went logging but no furber in sight to day

Friday Dec 14

this day begins with light winds from the north east with pleasant weather ship steering different courses under all sail
Lat 34-50 & Long 29-22 W
employed in catching at four o'clock P.M. raised eight whales hauled three boats but without success plenty of furber in sight

Saturday Dec 15

this day begins with light winds from the west with pleasant weather ship steering different courses at three o'clock P.M. raised eight whales on a log rope three boats caught one to the starboard and one to the starboard boat, the last one got them along side at eleven o'clock P.M.
Lat 34-46 & Long 28-44 W

Sunday Dec 16

this day begins with fine pleasant weather with the wind from the westward commenced putting at five o'clock P.M. hauled on and got one whale in at six P.M. got up and cleared away the head and hauled

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on to the ground whale at half past two took in the head and part of the body and got at half past seven cleared away the boat through the night
Lat 34-50 & Long 29-22 W

Monday Dec 17

this day begins with a strong wind from the north east with clear weather beginning to a strong gale with rain at five o'clock P.M. commenced boiling and clearing away the head at six o'clock P.M. hauled down with the boiler room full and a boat twenty barrels of flour down in the after hold out part of a wheel a long rope no sun to day

Tuesday Dec 18

this day begins with a strong gale from the north east with clear weather ship began to with part of a whale a long log commenced boiling at day light hauled up a boat twenty five barrels to day cooled down at dark it still blowing hard but the weather is clear saw eight whales to day but not one over hauled full no sun to day

Wednesday Dec 19

this day begins with a light gale from the east with clear weather ship began to commenced boiling at daylight started down about forty barrels of oil and got in part of a stinger rolled down getting up morning got through cutting at half past seven light down the hall and started going at three o'clock P.M. to Lat 34-50 & Long 28-50 W
