

Remarks on Board Bark Sarah B Hale 1877

Friday Dec 28

This day begins with a strong breeze from the west north west with clear weather ship steering by the wind heading to the northward under double reefed topsails at nine o'clock A.M. were ship and at three o'clock P.M. were back again
Lat 28-17 Long 29-08 W
nothing doing to day and nothing in sight

Saturday Dec 29

This day begins with a light breeze from the north west with fairly weather ship steering by the wind heading to the north east and under double reefed topsails at two o'clock P.M. wind heading to west south west with clear weather no sun to day and nothing in sight

Sunday Dec 30

This day begins with a strong breeze from the south west with fair weather ship steering by the wind heading to the north and west under double topsails at nine o'clock A.M. were ship heading to the south and east at twelve o'clock P.M. made sail steering south east by east
Lat 26-50 Long 29-54 W
nothing in sight to day

Monday Dec 31

This day begins with a fair breeze from the north north east with clear weather ship steering east south east under all sails at twelve o'clock P.M. took in the light sail and double reefed the topsails at four P.M. took in the fore sail and fore top

spoke the bark Vestigia captain Finck
with his wife 22 months from home with 1200
all told

Tuesday Sept 10 1878
spoke the bark Stafford capt. being 27 months
from home with 1100 all told
