Tuesday Mar 12

This day begins with light pleasant weather ship steering by the wind heading to the eastward under all sail
Lat 9-40 S Long 8-42 W
employed sighting ship nothing in sight to day

Wednesday Mar 13

This day begins with light pleasant weather ship steering by the wind heading to the eastward under all sail
Lat 9-08 S Long 9-40 E
employed sighting ship nothing in sight to day

Thursday Mar 14

This day begins with light pleasant weather ship steering by the wind heading to the eastward under all sail
Lat 10-00 S Long 10-01 E
employed in at 10.30 a number of pinbarks in sight

Friday Mar 15

This day begins with light winds and begins ship steering by the wind heading to the eastward under all sail
at 10 o'clock A.M. again ship heading then to the eastward at 11 o'clock A.M. sighted a whaler in sight all day

This day begins with light pleasant weather ship steering by the wind heading to the eastward under all sail
Lat 9-30 S Long 9-01 W
at 10 o'clock A.M. spoke the bark sea grey captain Pollock at 11 o'clock P.M. spoke the bark Pelmeto captain Taylor a great all day killed a hog to day

Sunday Mar 17

This day begins with light pleasant weather ship steering by the wind heading to the eastward under all sail
Lat 9-45 S Long 9-39 E
one ship in sight and pinbarks

Monday Mar 18

This day begins with light pleasant weather ship steering by the wind heading to the eastward under all sail
Lat 10-10 S Long 8-45 E
employed fitting the rigging setting down the main rigging at 10 o'clock P.M. raised the haly. Pelmeto spoke her at half past five o'clock until eleven

Tuesday Mar 19

This day begins with strong fresh ship steering by the wind heading to the eastward under all sail
Lat 10-20 S Long 9-21 E
employed fitting the rigging setting down bark Pelmeto in sight
