Sunday May 5

This day begins with light wind and fair weather ship starting by the wind heading to the eastward under all sail at seven o'clock A.M. took ship heading then to the southward and westward at five o'clock again
Lat. 45-00 S Long. 3-55 W
nothing in sight to day

Monday May 6

This day begins with light pleasant weather ship starting by the wind heading to the eastward under all sail
Lat. 45-30 S Long. 2-49 W
employed setting up fore stay also fore topmast cross deck and back stays broke out tops and back nothing in sight to day

Tuesday May 7

This day begins with strong trade wind ship starting by the wind heading to the eastward under top sails at five o'clock
Lat. 45-45 S Long. 1-24 W
employed setting up the main rigging sent up fore royal back stays and got mizzen aback and back stays nothing in sight to day

Wednesday May 8

This day begins with strong trade wind ship starting by the wind heading to the eastward under all sail
Lat. 46-25 S Long. 0-34 W
employed setting up main apparent and royal back stays also sent up mizzen aback and back stays and set up main foremast and aback rigging broke out water
saw a small white water

Lat. 46-15 S Long. 2-57 W
employed setting up the main rigging nothing in sight to day

Saturday May 11

This day begins with light pleasant weather ship starting by the wind heading to the eastward under all sail
Lat. 46-49 S Long. 3-57 W
employed setting up the main rigging nothing in sight to day but the topmast

Sunday May 12

This day begins with strong trade wind ship starting by the wind heading to the eastward under all sail
Lat. 47-16 S Long. 6-36 W
employed setting up the main rigging nothing in sight to day but the topmast
