Tuesday May 28

This day begins with light pleasant weather ship steering by the wind heaving to the eastward under all sail at right angles to the westward. Lat 9-40 Long 10-33 Employed boatswain Brown saw a rat and a mouse to day

Wednesday May 29

This day begins with light pleasant weather ship steering by the wind heaving to the westward under all sail outside of which the ship heaving to the southward and eastward Lat 9-26 Long 9-19 Nothing done to day saw two finbacks to day

Thursday May 30

This day begins with light pleasant weather ship steering different courses to the eastward under all sail

no sun to day employed carpenter put up a lining in the water bulk saw a narrow and two ships to day spoke the bark Portsmouth captain Ginn 23 months from home with 13 hundred captain and his wife

Friday May 31

This day begins with light pleasant weather ship steering different courses to the eastward under all sail Lat 9-28 Long 11-36 Employed carpenter at work on the water bulk at half past twelve Opl. J. P. visited system of sails heaving four boats started at twenty minutes to three P.M. got the top gear heaved starboard and went boats out then along side at six Opl. P.M. and got paper

Saturday June 1

This day begins with light pleasant weather ship laying with the head upwind a large whale's blow side worked on to the first line at six Opl. P.M. finished at seven and got breakfast at eight on to the second line at half past seven finished with the last one at nine P.M. cleared away the heads and started the work Lat 9-10 Long 10-46 Nothing in sight to day

Sunday June 2

This day begins with light pleasant weather ship steering by the wind heaving to the eastward under all sail except the courses Lat 9-20 Long 10-38 Employed boatswain finished at twelve Opl. no guests at nothing in sight to day
