

Remarks on Board Bark S. S. Gale

Monday June 3

This day begins with light pleasant weather ship steering by the wind heading to the westward under all sail at eight o'clock we were ship heading then to the eastward
Lat 9-30 S Long 9-59 W
Employed broke out beef and pork and butter saw green peas and a mark to day

Tuesday June 4

This day begins with light pleasant weather ship steering by the wind heading to the westward under all sail at six o'clock we were ship heading to the eastward
Lat 9-30 S Long 10-30 W
Employed stowing down oil saw black fish toward one boat caught nothing

Wednesday June 5

This day begins with light pleasant weather ship steering east north east under all sail
Lat 9-30 S Long 10-54 W
Employed broke out beef and pork caught a toad to day nothing more in sight

Thursday June 6

This day begins with light pleasant weather ship steering different courses to the eastward under all sail
Lat 9-00 S Long 10-30 W
Employed firing my shot for ketch bark ship at five o'clock we raised the bark hit a captain's cabin shot her at bark

Friday June 7

This day begins with light pleasant weather ship steering east under all sail
Lat 8-45 S Long 11-08 W
Employed passing fire saw the bark patrol this morning

Saturday June 8

This day begins with light pleasant weather ship steering east and east by north under all sail
Lat 8-05 S Long 12-12 W
Employed in oil broke out flowers four bags saw nothing to day but small fish

Sunday June 9

This day begins with light winds from the westward calm middle part raised the land at four o'clock bearing east by north ship steering different courses to the eastward under all sail
Lat 7-45 S Long 12-41 W
At four o'clock we pulled up the boat anchor and moved away the boat anchor steering for the land saw one ship at distance of one under way snapped at half past eight P.M. in 25 fathoms of water

Monday June 10

This day begins with the ship at anchor at seven o'clock we began to quarters boats bound up having saw nothing from the boats, spoke the cattle for boats also spoke the bathoon saw anchor at ten o'clock P.M. and anchored at the town of Pombay in fifty fathoms of water with 45 fathoms of chain boat came aboard at five P.M.
