Lat 5=14 S Long 8=25 E
at half past three tack ship heading then to the southward and eastward
at half past four raised sperm whales lowered three boats X

Monday sept 23

this day begins with light pleasant weather ship steaming by the wind heading to the southward and eastward under all sail
Lat 5=53 S Long 9=12 E
employed mending the fore sail
tack ship at four P.M. heading then to the westward nothing in sight to day
broke out water

Tuesday sept 24

this day begins with light pleasant weather ship steaming by the wind heading to the westward under all sail
Lat 6=05 S Long 8=28 E
employed mending the fore top sail
saw two finbacks to day

Wednesday sept 25

this day begins with light pleasant weather ship steaming by the wind heading to the westward under all sail
Lat 6=04 S Long 7=10 E
broke out beef saw one finback

Thursday sept 26

this day begins with light winds and calm ship steaming by the wind heading to the westward under all sail
Lat 6=37 S Long 6=08 E
employed overhauling blocks
killed a goat nothing in sight to day

this day begins with light winds and calm ship steaming by the wind heading to the westward under all sail
Lat 6=54 S Long 5=38 E
employed in ed Sbs nothing in sight

Saturday sept 28

this day begins with light winds and calm ship steaming by the wind heading to the westward under all sail
Lat 6=55 S Long 5=15 E
employed in ed Sbs broke out water and bread nothing in sight to day

Sunday sept 29

this day begins with light pleasant weather ship steaming by the wind heading to the southward and eastward under all sail
Lat 7=00 S Long
nothing doing and nothing in sight

Monday sept 30

this day begins with light pleasant weather ship steaming by the wind heading to the southward and eastward under all sail
Lat 7=30 S Long 3=24 E
employed in ed Sbs nothing in sight to day

Tuesday Oct 1

this day begins with a stiff breeze ship steaming by the wind heading to the westward under all sail
Lat 8=22 S Long 2=24 E
employed mending the spare boat at half past eight raised sperm whales lowered three boats hatched one each to the harbor and waist boats got along side at noon set them in finished at two P.M.
broke out pork
