Monday Oct 28

this day begins with light pleasant weather
ship steaming east north east under all sail

Lat 4-30 S Long 8-46 E

employed repairing the main sail

shortened sail left saw blackfish to day

Tuesday Oct 29

this day begins with light pleasant weather
ship steaming north east under all sail

Lat 4-35 S Long 9-46 E

employed mending the main sail finished and sent it
also sent the old fore sail and fore top sail

at 4 P.M. raised the fore top sail and sent it
to the foremast

employed mending the main sail finished and sent it

Wednesday Oct 30

this day begins with light pleasant weather
ship steaming by the wind heading to the
westward under all sail

Lat 5-40 S Long 9-11 E

employed mending the main top sail
broke out water saw a small white water

Thursday Oct 31
