

## Remarks on Board Bark S. B. Hale

Tuesday Nov 12

this day begins with a pleasant breeze  
ship steaming by the wind heading to the  
eastward under all sail sight of the tank  
ship heading then to the westward  
Lat 5-24 S Long 9-45 E  
nothing in sight and nothing doing to day

Wednesday Nov 13

this day begins with a pleasant breeze  
ship steaming by the wind heading to the westward  
under all sail  
Lat 4-56 S Long 8-22 W  
nothing doing and nothing in sight

Thursday Nov 14

this day begins with a pleasant breeze  
ship steaming by the wind heading to the  
westward under all sail at seven A.M. tank  
ship heading then to the southward and eastward  
Lat 4-28 S Long 7-00 E  
employed setting up the rib and flying jib gyres  
broke out water

Friday Nov 15

this day begins with a pleasant breeze  
ship steaming by the wind heading to the  
eastward under all sail raised a ship at daylight  
tank ship at seven A.M. heading then to the westward  
Lat 5-07 S Long 8-10 E  
saw nothing of the whale kind to day  
at two P.M. kept off to speak the bark  
stafford spoke her at six P.M.

Saturday Nov 16

this day begins with a strong breeze ship  
steaming by the wind heading to the eastward  
under topsails and courses jib and spanker at  
seven A.M. tank ship heading then to the westward  
later part light breeze made all sail  
Lat 4-48 S Long 7-09 E  
nothing doing nothing in sight to day

Sunday Nov 17

this day begins with a stiff breeze ship steaming  
by the wind heading to the westward under all sail  
at seven A.M. tank ship heading then to the  
eastward saw blackfish going to the board  
Lat 5-01 S Long 7-10 E

Monday Nov 18

this day begins with light pleasant weather  
ship steaming by the wind heading to the  
eastward under all sail  
Lat 5-27 S Long 8-06 E  
employed breaking out bread and beef  
nothing in sight to day

Tuesday Nov 19

this day begins with light pleasant weather  
ship steaming by the wind heading to the eastward  
under all sail  
Lat 5-37 S Long 9-11 E

saw a small white water and a school of blackfish

Wednesday Nov 20

this day begins with light pleasant weather  
ship steaming by the wind heading to the westward  
under all sail at eleven A.M. tank ship heading  
then to the eastward  
Lat 5-56 S Long 9-20 E  
took in the boat boat carpenter repairing her  
saw blackfish this morning broke out water

Thursday Nov 21

this day begins with light pleasant weather  
ship steaming by the wind heading to the  
eastward under all sail  
Lat 6-07 S Long 9-43 E  
at one P.M. tank ship for a white water  
which was four feet employed carpenter repairing  
the bow boat finished and put her out  
saw blackfish this morning
